A CHARTER ORDINANCE EXEMPTING THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS FROM THE PROVISIONS OF K.S.A. 14-201 ONLY AS IT RELATES TO SPECIFICATION OF CERTAIN SALARIES BY ORDINANCE, AND PROVIDING SUBSTITUTE AND ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS ON THE SAME SUBJECT NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY

OF THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS: Section 1: That the City of Norton, Kansas by power vested in it by Article 12 Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, hereby elects to exempt itself from and make inapplicable to it certain provisions of K.S.A. 14-201 relating to the establishment of the salaries of the Municipal Judge, the Police Chief, the City Clerk, the City Attorney, and City Police Officers by Ordinance and hereby providing substitute and additional provisions as set forth herein. Such referenced statute is

applicable to this City but not uniformly applicable to all cities. Section 2. That the substitute and additional provisions shall provide that the salaries of the Municipal Judge, the Police Chief, The City Clerk, the City Attorney and City Police Officers shall be established by adoption of an annual Resolution or by establishment of Pay Ranges and Pay Scales as adopted in the annual City

of Norton Employee Handbook and any amendments or additions thereto. Section 3. That this ordinance shall be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in the Norton Telegram, the official City Newspaper.

Section 4. That this is a Charter Ordinance and shall take effect sixty-one (61) days after its final publication unless within 60 days of its final publication a Petition signed by a number of electors of the City of Norton, Kansas equal to not less than ten percent of the number of electors who voted at the last preceding regular city election shall be filed in the Office of the City Clerk of Norton, Kansas demanding an election on the Charter Ordinance, in which case the Charter Ordinance shall become effective only if and when approved by a majority of the electors voting
