## Blue Jays defeat Lakin in Bi-District

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton Community High School football team traveled to Lakin to play the District No.16 champions on Tuesday evening and returned with an impressive 62-22 victory and the Bi-District championship!

The Blue Jays are now 7-3 for the season and will host Beloit, an 8-2 team, for the Regional championship tomorrow at 7 p.m. at Travis Field in Norton.

Early into the game, the eventual outcome was clear as Norton dominated on both offense and defense. Norton's Caleb Laughlin kicked off to start the game and it turned out to be his best night effort on kickoffs.

The Bronc running back was tackled on their 6-yard line and everything went downhill for Lakin from there.

Norton scored on every single possession in the first half, hitting the end zone five times in the first quarter for a 34-0 lead and four times in the second period for a 62-0 halftime advantage.

Blue Jay head coach Lucas Melvin played his junior varsity players against the Bronc varsity the last half and they also played well despite giving up three touchdowns.

Norton senior linebacker J.D. Gall set the tone on defense when he tackled Lakin senior running back Alex Saenz after a 1 yard gain on the first play from scrimmage. On second down, Lakin senior quarterback Dylan Shalberg went back to pass on his 7-yard line and connected with Gall who scampered into the end zone! Laughlin, who boomed kickoffs and extra point kicks all night long, split the uprights and Norton led 7-0 with 57 seconds played!

Junior tailback Terrell Lane scored from 24 yards out with 8:35 left and Laughlin's kick made it 14-0. Senior quarterback Connor Pfannenstiel got in on the scoring with 6:47 remaining after Gall's second pass interception when he hit paydirt from 13 yards out. Laughlin's kick made it 21-0.

Lane got his second touchdown of the night on a 13 yard run with 3:26 left which was set up by a 12 yard keeper by Pfannenstiel and a 14 yard carry by Lane after taking a pitch from Pfannenstiel. The extra point kick was blocked, leaving the score at 27-0.

After Norton junior defensive end Rylee Stanley recovered a Lakin fumble on the Bronc 19 and Norton was moved back on a holding penalty, junior quarterback Spencer Shirk passed to senior fullback Zane Perez for a 26 yard touchdown. Laughlin's extra point kick made it 34-0 with 2:02 left in the first quarter.

To start the second quarter, Norton senior defensive back Landon

Hamel found running room on a punt return and scampered 71 yards to the end zone! Laughlin split the uprights with another booming kick and it was 41-0 with 22 seconds gone in the period.

On Lakin's next possession, the Brones had success with a 35-yard pass play so they tried another aerial. That was not a good decision. Pfannenstiel, who also plays defensive back, intercepted and returned the pigskin to the Norton 31. On first down, Lane ran over a Lakin player en route to a 43 yard gain to the Bronc 36. The next play, Hamel got the ball and sprinted through the Bronc defense for his second touchdown! Laughlin's kick made it 48-0 with 9:45 left in the first half.

After Laughlin's eighth kickoff and another three-and-out forced by the "Blue Swarm" defense, Hamel returned the Lakin punt 19 yards to the Bronc 49.

On first down, Gall got in on the scoring act again as he caught a pass from Pfannenstiel and he weaved his way through traffic for his second score of the night. Laughlin's extra point kick extended the Norton advantage to 55-0 with 6:59 left in the half.

Thanks to an illegal participation penalty against Norton and 25 yard pass play where Lakin senior wide receiver Josh Walters made a diving catch, the Brones got to the Norton 18 but Blue Jay senior defensive back Ashton Draper killed any chances the home team had when he intercepted a pass on the Norton 7-yard line.

The distance to the goalline didn't bother the Blue Jays. Perez gained 12 yards and 34 yards on two carries. Afer a block in the back penalty against Norton, junior tailback Jeremy Sproul bowled over a Lakin defender en route to a 64 yard touchdown run! Laughlin split the uprights once again, extending the shutout to 62-0 with 1:26 left in the half.

The second half was shortened by the continuous clock, which runs in the second half following a lead by one team of over 40


The Broncs' Zach Reed scored on a 5-yard pass from quarterback Shalberg with 4:55 left in the third quarter. The extra point kick was no good, making the score 62-6 after three quarters.

Lakin's second touchdown came on an 11 yard run by Alex Jones with 8:25 left in the game. Alex Saenz ran for two extra points and it was 62-14.

The Broncs' final score came with time running out on a 2 yard pass from Shalberg to Jones. Saenz ran for two extra points to make the final score 62-22.

"We played an excellent game," said coach Melvin.

"We were ready to play and executed very well. We were the aggressor and our young men played with a sense of urgency.

Norton rolled up 275 yards rushing on 30 carries for a 9.2 yards per carry average.

Lakin managed 143 rushing yards on 35 tries for a 4 yard average. In the first half, the Broncs rushed for just 38 yards on 24 attempts for a 1.6 yard average.

The Blue Jays competed 3 of 9 passes for 78 yards and the Broncs were successful on 5 of 16 passes for 101 yards.

Total yardage was 353 for Norton and 254 for Lakin, most of which came in the second half versus the Blue Jay junior var-

Other Blue Jay ball carriers were: Landon Hamel, 1 for 36; Tye Nickell, 4 for 17; Trey Millan, 3 for 2; Dalton Miller, 2 for minus 4; Jordan Wahlmeier, 3 for minus 16; Jacob Brooks, 2 for 1 Hamel led Norton's special

teams with 3 punt returns for 117 yards and a 39 yard average and 1 touchdown. Pfannenstiel had 1 punt return for 19 yards.

In addition to Gall's 2 pass interceptions, Pfannenstiel, Draper and Brooks each had 1.

Beloit won their Bi-District championship on Tuesday evening with a come-from-behind 28-23 victory over a visiting Lyons eleven.

Trailing 23-22 with less than 2 minutes left in the game, Beloit held Lyons on its 2-yardline. On the first play from scrimmage, Logan Eck broke loose on a sweep around right end and scampered 98 yards for the game-winning touchdown.

Beloit trailed 20-8 at halftime and 23-14 at the end of three quarters. Luke Shamburg caught a 20-yard scoring pass from Eck in the fourth quarter to set the stage for the dramatic ending.

Eck, a senior, finished the game with 317 yards rushing on 33 carries and two touchdowns. He averaged 9.6 yards per carry. The 5'9", 175 pound Eck had 1,500plus yards rushing last season.

Beloit's only two losses this season were to Ellsworth and Southeast of Saline. Norton's only losses have been to unbeaten Smith Center, Ellis and Scott

"They run a double wing offense and run the ball most of the time," said coach Melvin. "Eck is an outstanding running back. He runs hard and is difficult to

"Our defensive line will have to play really well and get penetration. Our offensive line will also have to play well.

"We'll have to come out and play with the same intensity we had at Lakin.

"We're excited about playing Beloit and will be ready.'
