Boys basketball opening loss after 79 straight wins

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Doug Reusink's Norton Community High School boys basketball team didn't win many games last season but returns six lettermen, three of them starters, and the 2008-09 experience should pay dividends this time

around. The Blue Jays open the 2009-10 campaign on Saturday when they host Atwood in the NCHS Stull Gymnasium. Games will begin at 3 p.m. with the junior varsity boys contest in the Wilmeth Kirk Memorial Gym. Also, at 3 p.m., the girls junior varsity game will begin in the NCHS Stull Gymnasium, followed by the varsity girls and varsity boys contests.

Returning starters for Norton are 5'10" senior guard Landon Hamel, 5'10" senior guard J.D. Gall and 6'1" senior forward Ashton Draper.

Other returning lettermen are 5'7" senior guard Marcus Herman, 6'1" sophomore post Jordan Wahlmeier and 5'8" sophomore guard Tye Nickell.

Dakota Dreher, a 5'10" junior, is also a returning letterman but is recovering from an injury and will not play this season.

Other members of the 2009-10 team are: Terrell Lane, 5'11"; Cole Archer, 6'; Luke Ninemire, 6', juniors; Dillon McConney, 6'; Zach Hartwell, 5'4", sophomores; Chris Fisher, 5'4"; Ryan Bainter, 5'7"; Lane Archer, 5'9"; Jacob

Brooks, 5'11"; Andrew Ellis, 5'10"; John Renner, 5'10"; Dalton Miller, 5'10"; Dylan Sprigg, 6'1"; Javen Colip, 5'7"; Lane Bigge, 5'11", freshmen.

Norton lost only one senior off last season's team, so most of the statistics leaders return. Landon Hamel was leading scorer last year, averaging 12.7 points per game. J.D. Gall was third high scorer with an average of 6.5 points per contest and Ashton Draper was fourth best with an average of 6.1 points.

Draper hit an exceptional 81.8 percent of his free throws to lead the team in that category. Hamel was second high from the charity stripe at 57 percent.

Draper was also second high in rebounds with 124 for the season, an average of 6 per game.

Hamel was leader in steals with a total of 55. Gall had 37 thefts. Assists leader for the Blue Jays was Hamel with 59, followed by Gall, 48 and Tye Nickell, 27. Jordan Wahlmeier was second high in blocked shots with 7.

David Stover is an assistant coach again this season.

Student managers are Kylie Nuzum, Brae Bigge, Treven Rossi and David Cressler.

Coach's comments

"This year's team will be small but very athletic," said coach Reusink. "With improved depth and experience, we should be a more competitive group than we were a year ago.

"With four returning starters and two of them first team all-league, Plainville should be considered the favorite in the Mid-Continent League; however, most teams in the league have two or three starters returning which should make it very competitive."

Veteran head coach

Coach Reusink is beginning his 31st year of coaching high school boys teams and has compiled an overall record of 438 wins and 212 losses for an excellent 67 percent victory record. This is an average of 14.6 wins and 7 losses per year.

Under the tutelage of coach Reusink, the 2002-03 Norton quintet won the Class 3A state basketball championship with a 22-5 record and the 2003-04 squad was also outstanding, compiling an 18-4 record. The 2004-05 Blue Jays were 15-7.

The Norton boys' 2005-06 record was 12-8 and they finished second in the Mid-Continent League tournament. The 2006-07 squad was 14-7, tied for second in the league and placed second in the league tournament. The 2007-08 team went 15-7, placed third in the league and third in the league tournament but left Norton without any returning starters and only three lettermen for the 2008-

In Class 2-1A, Smith Center's long unbeaten streak ended with a 20-12 overtime loss to Centralia. The Redmen had drawn national attention with their 79 game winning record and five straight state championships.

Smith Center trailed 6-0 after one quarter but a Schubart field goal and touchdown run by Stansbury in the second quarter put the Redmen on top 9-6 at halftime. The only scoring in the third quarter was a Centralia touchdown to give them a 12-9 lead.

The first quarter ended with Wichita Collegiate leading 14-10. LeMaster had a 19 yard pass from Jablonski for one touchdown and LeMaster returned a kickoff 99 yards for the other. Both teams scored once in the second period as Bailey caught a 23 yard pass from Jablonski to make the score 21-17 at intermission.

"Defensively, we feel we can be pretty good. We have some quickness and some height so that is a good combination.

"Overall, we just have to get people some experience at the varsity level and, hopefully, after Christmas we will be ready to

"The Mid-Continent League race is going to be very tough this year. Hill City, Trego, Smith Center, Phillipsburg and Osborne all have solid teams coming back. There is probably more balance in the league top to bottom than we have had for awhile.

"We can't afford let-ups and, if we can play hard every time out, we might end up surprising some people this year. Our seniors have shown great leadership so far and that needs to continue."

Long time tenure In his 27 years as head coach of

the Lady Blue Jays, coach Jilka's

teams have won 462 games and lost 150 for a 75 percent winning average. Jilka's Lady Jays have averaged 17 wins and just 5.6 losses per season.

Following their fourth place finish in the state tournament in 2000-01, coach Jilka's 2001-02 Lady Jays finished 13-9 and placed fourth in the league. Norton compiled a 12-9 record in 2003-04 when they tied for second in the league and their season ended with a 56-49 overtime loss to Beloit in the substate tourna-

The season ended for the 2004-05 quintet with a loss to eventual champion Holcomb in the substate tournament. The Lady Jays were 17-5 that year and were undefeated league champions and also league tournament champions.

The 2005-06 Norton girls compiled an 18-2 record, were undefeated in the Mid-Continent League and runner-up in the league tournament. Their season came to a sudden close with a 44-33 loss to Riley County in the substate tournament.

The 2006-07 Lady Jays were 13-7 and also placed third in the league tournament. Their season ended with a 46-42 loss to Oberlin in the substate tournament.

The 2007-08 Norton girls won the substate championship and lost their first game in the state tournament 45-39 to Wichita Collegiate.
