# CodeRED a useful alert system

calling system, has been in use by Norton County for three years and has been useful in alerting residents to emergency situations like the blizzard conditions last week.

Norton County Sheriff Troy Thomson said calls were made Sunday, to inform city residents to move their cars from emergency snow routes; on Monday to let

people know which precautions to take in the blizzard and on Tuesday calls went out to Norton County Courthouse employees to let them know the courthouse would be closed.

On Sunday, 1,558 calls were attempted with 1,106 being reached, and on Monday 2,493 calls were attempted with 1,805 being reached.

Thomson said the system helped keep accidents down because people knew to avoid

driving in the weather.

"During different weather and emergency situations, CodeRED has contributed to the safety of our citizens," he said.
