# C-Team competes in invite

Northern Valley also competed in the tournament and placed second.

They defeated Phillipsburg in the first round and Quinter in the semi-finals but lost to Hill City in the championship game.

Two Norton players, Jacob Brooks and Zach Hartwell and Gunnar Hays of Northern Valley were chosen to the All-Tournament Team.

#### **Hill City**

In the loss to Hill City, Norton trailed by quarters 11-4, 27-19 and 48-29.

Leading scorer for the young Blue Jays was Zach Hartwell with 14 points, followed by John Renner, 8; Jacob Brooks, 7; Lane Archer, 5: Dalton Miller, 4: Andrew Ellis, 1.

Anderson was high scorer for the Ringnecks with 18 points; Pfeifer added 15.

"This was a disappointing overall performance for us," said Norton assistant coach David Stover. "We did not compete very well and made too many mistakes in every aspect of the game.

Hartwell was leading scorer again for Norton, this time with 14 points, followed by Brooks, 13; Renner, 12; Miller, 6; Archer, 5; Ellis, 2.

Bruggeman led Oberlin in scoring with 19 points.

"I was pleased that we bounced back after the lackluster performance against Hill City to earn our first win of the season," said

coach Stover.

"The game was close most of the first half and early into the third quarter, placing us in a very similar situation as the previous day. This time, we responded well and were able to pull away for the victory."

In the win over Phillipsburg, Norton held quarter advantages of 15-9, 31-21 and 42-29.

"This was easily the best overall performance of the tournament for us," said coach Stover. "We were solid early both offensively and defensively and jumped out and took a commanding lead.

"We had positive contributions from all of our boys in the game.

"Overall, this was a very good tournament for us. We had two victories but, more importantly, we saw improvement in all aspects of our play as the tournament progressed.

"We got quality playing time for many of our players and, hopefully, that experience will help them to continue to improve as the season continues."


