

Huskies lose to Stockton

The Northern Valley Huskies lost a close 68-61 basketball game to Stockton at home on Jan. 5.

In the first quarter, the Northern Valley offense got a big boost with three baskets from beyond the arc. Huskies Tyson Callaway and Colton Lowry each scored a three point basket with Lowry hitting a second three pointer. Austin Herman and Brian Siard added to the tally with a two point shot each.

Yet, the Stockton Tigers made one extra point to end the quarter with a lead of 14-13.

The second quarter was a high scoring quarter with Husky Dusty Eagleburger bringing in a total of three two pointers, a three pointer and four out of seven free throws for a total of 13 points. Lowry added to the score with four out of six free throws for a total of 17 points to the Tigers' 23 points. This put the Tigers in the lead 37-30 at the half.

In the third quarter, the Huskies came out strong to score 14 points over the Tigers' 12. Lowry, Callaway and Herman each hit a three pointer. Adding to the score, Herman had a two pointer and Eagleburger hit three out of four free throws. This put the third quarter score at Tigers 49, Huskies 44.

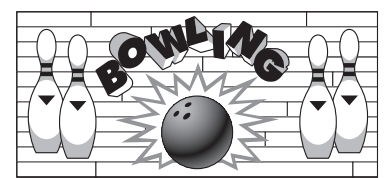
In the final quarter, the Huskies played and scored well. Once again, Eagleburger brought in a three point basket as well as a two pointer and made both of his free throws. Herman assisted with a three pointer and hit both of his free throws. Lowry had a three pointer and Callaway a two point basket bringing their total points for the quarter to 17. It was a quarter well played but not enough to beat the 19 points the Stockton Tigers took home by the end of the game.

Coach Chuck Fessenden said,

"I am proud of the way our boys played tonight. We showed a lot of improvement over Christmas break. Unfortunately we came up a little bit short."

The leading scorer for the Huskies was Dusty Eagleburger with 23 points. Colton Lowry had 16; Austin Herman, 12; Tyson Callaway, 8 and Brian Siard, 2. The leading rebounder was Lowry with 8 rebounds.

The junior varsity lost 59-50 to Stockton. Leading scorers for the Huskies were Alex Tharman and Gunnar Hays, each making 11 points each.

Huskies defeated by Rock Hills 37-35 in overtime in Mankato

The Northern Valley Huskies lost a 37-35 overtime basketball game to Rock Hills in Mankato on Dec. 12.

In the first quarter, Huskies Austin Herman and Zach Vincent each scored a two pointer while Rock Hills hit a field goal and free throw to end the first quarter tied 4 to 4.

The second quarter brought more points for the Huskies with Austin Herman and Dusty Eagleburger each scoring a three point basket. Bryant Tharman and Herman each hit a two point shot. Colton Lowry and Herman made a free throw each that brought

the second quarter total points earned up to 12 against Rock Hills seven points. The half time score was Northern Valley 16, Rock Hills 11.

Rock Hills gained momentum in the third quarter, scoring ten total points.

Northern Valley tallied six points in the quarter thanks once again to Herman and Eagleburger each making a three point basket. This ended the quarter with a 22 to 21 lead for the Huskies.

In the fourth quarter, Rock Hills edged the Huskies by scoring 10 points to the Huskies 9 points. Eagleburger was on fire with another three pointer and a couple more two point baskets. With the

added two from Byant Tharman, this tied the game at 31 all and put the game into overtime.

In overtime play, the Huskies scored four more points on free throws from Lowry and Eagleburger.

It was not enough to take the win from Rock Hills with their one free throw and a three pointer by R. Konen and the two pointer made by B. Ost.

Coach Chuck Fessenden said, "We did an excellent job on defense. We also rebounded very well against a much taller team. We needed to shoot better at the line and come up with a couple of plays in overtime."

The leading scorer for the Hus-

kies was Dusty Eagleburger with 15 total points.

He made half of his free throws, three three pointers and two two-point shots.

Next, Austin Herman hit a total of 11 points followed by Bryant Tharman, 3; Colton Lowry, 3; Zach Vincent, 2. Rock Hills' high scorers were R. Konen, B. Ost and D. Bohnert all with nine points each.

The junior varsity game against Rock Hills ended with a loss of 48-26. The leading Husky scorer for this game was Gunnar Hays with a total of nine points.

The Norton Community High School junior varsity wrestlers got the new year off to a great start last Friday by winning the championship of the varsity Elm Creek Invitational Wrestling Tournament in Elm Creek, Neb.

All eight Norton wrestlers placed as they ran up a team total of 129.5 points. Overton was second with 106, followed by Arapahoe, 99.5; Alma, 85; Burwell-Sargent, 53.5; Elm Creek, 47.5; Lexington JV, 34; Pleasanton, 28; Unattached, 21; Holdrege JV, 20; Southern Valley, 16; Gibbon JV, 3.

Norton had five gold medal winners: R.J. Ellis, 112; Justin Waggoner, 125; Eli Bozarth, 145; Rylee Stanley, 152 and Casey Robison, 189.

Jared Bohl, 140, was runner-up. Taylor Gordon, 103 and Cody Ellis, 130, each placed third.

"Our junior varsity wrestlers are doing a good job of focusing on doing their best individually each time out," said Norton assistant wrestling coach Shane Miller. "They understand that, if they do this, they will be in contention for bringing home team placings in tournaments.

"Each of these wrestlers is starting to understand the little things we are stressing in the practice room. I am very proud of how they are trying to transfer this to the mat.

"The time these wrestlers put in over the Christmas break and

extra work on technique is paying off.

"R.J. Ellis dominated the competition with three falls and an impressive performance over Lukas Cox of Alma in the finals. He continues to work hard and get better on his feet. He did not give up a takedown for the tournament. For his performance, he is this week's 'Junior Varsity Wrestler of the Week'.

"Also putting together good tournaments were Eli Bozarth and Casey Robison. Eli picked up a first round fall, then put together a tough 13-0 performance over Michael Zorn of Overton. Eli wrestled a smart match in the finals, picking up a late three-point near fall and victory over Patrick Gardner of Arapahoe.

"Casey Robison wrestled sell with a technical fall in the semi-finals over Chase Nilsen of Pleasanton and wore down Luis Arredondo of Overton for the fall in the finals.
