Jays lose to Phillipsburg 54-39 in MCL tournament

The No.5 seeded Norton Community High School boys varsity basketball team traveled to WaKeeney on Thursday to play No.8 seeded Phillipsburg in the consolation semi-finals of the Mid-Continent League Tournament and lost the contest by a 54-39 score.

For one half, the score was close and all indications were that it would be a tight contest in the second half as well and come down to the wire much as the earlier game between the two teams in Phillipsburg which went into overtime and was won 55-54 by the Blue Jays.

That did not happen, however, as the Panthers grabbed the momentum and pulled out for the win with the same number of points the last time around and the Blue Jays came up short of their last offensive performance against the Panthers.

Phillipsburg led 12-9 after one quarter. Both teams hit 15 points in the second quarter to make it a three-point advantage at 27-24 for the Panthers at intermission.

Phillipsburg put together a 17 point third period compared to just 8 points for Norton to stretch their advantage to 44-32. A 10-7 fourth quarter in favor of the Panthers extended the final margin of victory to 15 points.

Sophomore forward Jordan Wahlmeier hit three two-point baskets for Norton in the first

Freshman guard Jacob Brooks hit Norton's other two-point basket in the quarter and senior forward Ashton Draper added a free throw.

In Norton's 15-point second quarter, Wahlmeier added two more baskets, senior guard J.D. Gall hit a trey and two-point basket, junior forward Dakota Dreher hit a basket and free throw, Brooks hit another basket and sophomore guard Dillon McConney swished a free throw.

Junior guard Terrell Lane hit two two-point baskets, McConney hit a shot from beyond the arc and Draper hit a free throw for Norton's only third quarter

McConney drained another trey and Wahlmeier and Lane each hit another basket for the Blue Jays' fourth quarter points.

"I was disappointed in our play the entire game," said Norton head boys basketball coach Doug Reusink. "We were lucky to be down by only three points at halftime.

"We just had no intensity. Nobody was stepping up to make plays on a consistent basis.

"We weren't defending like we normally do. We started feeling sorry for ourselves and not focusing on playing good basketball.

Wahlmeier was the only Norton player who hit baskets consistently in the game. He connected on 6 of 9 shots from the field for an excellent 67 percent accuracy and led the team with 12 points.

Leading scorer for Phillipsburg was Justin Hoft with 13 points; Trevor Smith and Skye Long each added 12 points.

As a team, Norton hit 3 of 8 long range shots for 38 percent, 13 of 36 two-point tries for 36 percent and 16 of 44 overall for 36 percent. Phillipsburg connected

on 1 of 5 from beyond the arc for 20 percent, 24 of 41 two-point attempts for 59 percent and 25 of 46 overall for 54 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton swished 4 of 11 for 36 percent and the Panthers hit 5 of 11 for 45 percent.

Norton was outrebounded 34-20. The Blue Jays pulled down 8 offensive and 12 defensive caroms while the Panthers grabbed 9 offensive and 25 defensive

Dakota Dreher was leading rebounder for Norton with 6, followed by Terrell Lane, 5; Jacob Brooks, 4; Jordan Wahlmeier, 3; J.D. Gall, Dillon McConney, 1 each.

Both teams had 9 steals. Lane led Norton with 3 thefts, followed by Tye Nickell, 2; McConney, Draper, Brooks, Dreher, 1 each.

The Blue Jays had just 9 assists compared to 17 for the Panthers. Marcus Herman and Brooks each had 2 assists, followed by Wahlmeier, Nickell, Lane, Gall, Dreher, 1 each.


