Blue Jays champions of MCL wrestling tournament

their string of nine straight victories in the annual Mid-Continent League Tournament end last season when they were edged by onehalf point by Smith Center but this year they may have started another string by running away with the

championship! Any doubts about this year's champion team were erased early and the Blue Jays built up a final total of 229.5 points. Second place Phillipsburg was 54.5 points behind with 175 points. Third place went to Smith Center with 105, followed by Ellis, 97; Osborne, 53; Stockton, 41; Plainville, 36; Hill City, 35; Trego Community,

All 14 of Norton's wrestlers placed in the tournament. The Blue Jays had five champions, five runners-up, two third place finishers and two fourth place finishers.

Champions were freshman John Risewick, 103; junior Billy Broeckelman, 130; senior Kaenon Keiswetter, 145; junior Spencer Shirk, 160 and senior Casey Robison, 215.

Finishing runner-up were junior Troy Bainter, 125; junior Brett Terrell, 135; senior Zane Perez, 171; junior Kaid McKenna, 189 and senior Tyler Cook, 285.

Third place finishers for the Blue Jays were senior Connor Pfannenstiel, 140 and junior Landon Keiswetter, 152.

Placing fourth for Norton were sophomore R.J. Ellis, 112 and

freshman Carson McKenna, 119. Norton compiled a won-loss record of 28-11 and had a pin ratio

of 18-5.

"We came away with five champions, which I was happy to see, but I have a bitter taste in my mouth because our team can wrestle a lot better," said Norton head wrestling coach Bill Johnson.

"We let several matches slip period to place fourth. away. Every close call went against us. We put ourselves in a position in the last seconds of matches that cost us several championships and several other matches throughout the day. We didn't compete all the way through matches. It's our fault for letting ourselves get in those

"I'm not at all happy with our wrestling in this tournament because I know we can do better. We can learn from our mistakes

Coach Johnson named Kaenon Keiswetter as varsity "Wrestler of the Week" for his performance in the tournament. To win the championship at 145 pounds, he decisioned No.1 seed Trevor Oliver, Osborne, 8-3 to hand Oliver his first loss of the season. Oliver placed third in the state tournament at 140 pounds last season when he compiled a 35-1 record.

"I was really pleased with the way Kaenon wrestled," said coach Johnson. "In the finals, he beat Oliver very handily. Kaenon won a tough bracket."


