Norton led 14-12 after one quarter but dropped behind in the second quarter when the Ringnecks outscored them 20-9 to lead 32-23 at halftime. A 17-13 third quarter in Hill City's favor extended their lead to 49-36.

The Blue Jays kept battling in the fourth quarter and outscored the Ringnecks 15-10 but it wasn't enough to take the lead for the

Sophomore forward Jordan Wahlmeier led the way in the scoring department for Norton in the first quarter when he hit three field goals. Junior guard Terrell Lane buried a three-point shot and also hit a two-pointer and sophomore guard Dillon McConney also drained a three-point shot for Norton's 14 first quarter scores.

In the 9-point second period for Norton, senior guard J.D. Gall hit his first of five treys in the contest. Wahlmeier added two more two-point field goals and Lane hit another.

Gall left the nets smoking after he hit three baskets from beyond the arc in the third quarter. Freshman guard Jacob Brooks and Lane each hit two-point field goals in the 13-point period.

Lane warmed up from the field in Norton's 15-point fourth quarter as he drained a shot from beyond the arc and hit three twopointers. Gall found the range one last time from long range and added a free throw and Brooks hit another two-point basket.

"I was happy with the way we played," said Norton head boys basketball coach Doug Reusink. "We need to be more consistent. We had them on the ropes early and they did some good things to get back in it.

"They had some tough matchups for us. Offensively, they do a lot of good things. If you don't do the right things defensively, you get burned."

Lane ended with 18 points in the game on 2 of 6 from long range for 33 percent, 6 of 10 two-point shots for 60 percent and 8 of 16 overall for 50 percent.

Gall's three-point baskets allowed him to finish with 16 points. He was a perfect 5 of 5 from long range for 100 percent and added 1 of 4 free throws. He missed his only two two-point shots.

Wahlmeier scored 10 points on 5 of 7 from the field for 71 percent shooting.

Corey Lewis was leading scorer for Hill City with 19 points, 11 of them in the Ringnecks' 20-point second quarter. Reggie Jordan added 18 points for the Ringnecks.


