Blue Jay wrestlers win regional again

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School wrestling team extended their Class 3-2-1A Regional Wrestling Championships to six in a row with a dominating 2010 win during competition Friday and Saturday in the NCHS Stull Gymnasium in Norton.

The win was even more special since 7 of the 10 state-ranked teams and over 50 percent of the state ranked wrestlers in Class 3-2-1A were competing.

The Blue Jays turned in some outstanding individual performances during the two days but the victory was definitely a team win, with 10 of

two third place finishes. Oakley also third in the state his sophomore year. qualified five with two champions, one He is ranked No.1 in the state. runner-up and two fourth places.

Smith Center qualified four wrestlers with two champions, one runnerup and one fourth place finisher.

Coach's comments

'Qualifying 10 of our wrestlers for the state tournament is testament to the tough competition we see throughout the year," said coach Johnson.

"Plus, our wrestlers' mentality is that they will wrestle their best no matter how tough the opponent.

"Every wrestler on our team gave their all in the tournament and wrestled the best they have all year.

"This season, we've nicknamed the 13 Norton wrestlers among the four ourselves the 'Band of Brothers' qualifiers from each weight class for and our fans are 'The Brotherhood'. the State Tournament this Friday and Our crowd was tremendous. Spencer Shirk was injured after Christmas last season so didn't complete the 2009 season.



Norton had five individual champions, three runners-up and two fourth place finishers.

The No.1 state ranked Blue Jay wrestlers ran away with the championship, compiling 218 points.

Runner-up team was No.3 state ranked Phillipsburg with 132 points and No.4 state ranked Hoxie placed third with 111. No.6 state ranked Oakley placed fourth just one point behind Hoxie with 110.

Defending state champion Smith Center, who is ranked No.7 in the state, was fifth with 108,50. Atwood placed sixth with 99 and No.9 stateranked Thomas More Prep of Hays, was seventh with 81. Goodland, who is had beaten him previously. ranked No.5 in the state, placed eighth with 78.5 points.

Beloit placed ninth with 77.50 and Plainville tenth with 68.50. They were followed by Osborne, 63; Oberlin, 61.50; Ellis, 52; St. Francis, 51.50; Belleville, 22; Hill City, 17; Stockton, 14; Trego Community, 9.5; Mankato, 2.5; Pike Valley, 0; Cheylin, 0.

Runners-up were junior Billy Broeckelman, 130; senior Kaenon Keiswetter, 145 and senior Zane Perez, 171.

•112 - R.J. Ellis lost his first match by a 12-7 decision to No.5 seed Braden Sahlfeld, Beloit. In the consolation bracket, he pinned Kyle Helberg, Hill City, in :40 but lost a hard-fought 6-5 decision to No.6 seed Dustin Vap, Atwood, to end his season with a 13-16 record.

No.1 ranked and returning 103 pound state champion Dylan Schumacher, TMP, won the championship with a 15-1 major decision over No.2 seed and No.2 state ranked, Calvin Ochs, Hoxie. Third place went to Sahlfeld with an 11-6 decision over Vap

Schumacher is now 33-1 for the season and Ochs is 26-9.

•119-Carson McKenna won an 11-2 major decision over Mat Heim, Hoxie, in the first round but then had to wrestle No.1 seed Cole Werner, Plainville, who is ranked No.2 in the state and placed fourth in the state last season at 112. Werner pinned McKenna in 5:04 to drop him into the consolation bracket where he wrestled No.2 seed and No.3 state ranked Carlos Gallaway, Stockton. McKenna gave him a fight but Gallaway won 10-7 to end McKenna's season at 13-13.

Werner won the championship with an 11-2 major decision over No.3 seed Chris Ceman, Phillipsburg. Third place went to No.4 seed Garth Griffith, Atwood, when Galloway defaulted.

Werner is now 24-6 and Ceman, who is ranked No.5 in the state and was fifth in the state last year at 103, is 23-11. Griffith, who is ranked No.6 in the state, is 30-5 and Gallaway is 22-9.

•125 - Troy Bainter was seeded No. 1. He pinned Devin Simon, Atwood, in :48, then won an 8-4 decision over No.5 seed Brent Juenemann, Oberlin. In the championship finals, he
