gressive defense leads Jays to victory

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com An aggressive man-to-man defense that held Colby to only three baskets and nine points in the first half helped the Norton Community High School boys varsity basketball team defeat the visiting Eagles 46-39 on Tuesday evening in the NCHS Stull Gymnasium in Norton.

"I was happy with our effort," said Norton head boys basketball coach Doug Reusink. "Our defense was especially good in the first half.

"In the second half, we did things we needed to do to win the game. We held off their fourth quarter run by hitting our free throws down the stretch."

It was "Senior Night" so Norton senior boys basketball players and Dance Team members were honored along with their parents prior to the game.

Norton has three senior boys basketball players. They are Ashton Draper, son of Laurie Cliff and Denny Draper; J.D. Gall, son of Patty and John Gall and Marcus Herman, son of Claire and Joe Herman. All three have participated in basketball all four years of their high school careers.

There are two senior members of the Dance Team and they were honored along with their parents. They are Ashlie Stewart, daughter of Abi and Ron Delimont and Cindy and Mike Stewart and Bethany Winkel, daughter of Joanie and Darin Winkel.

Ashlie has been on the team for four years and this is Bethany's first year.

Both teams hit 15 points in the fourth quarter but Colby swished six field goals compared to four by Norton. The difference came at the charity stripe where the Blue Jays connected on 7 of 11. Colby hit 2 of 2 charities in the final stanza.

The score was tied 6-all after one quarter in which junior guard Terrell Lane hit two field goals and sophomore forward Jordan Wahlmeier hit one.

Lane found the range from three-point range in the second quarter, hitting two shots from beyond the arc. Wahlmeier hit Norton's other basket, a two-

pointer. Freshman guard Jacob Brooks hit three free throws in the period.

Lane continued to find the range on his shots in the third quarter when he connected on four two-point attempts. Wahlmeier hit two more baskets and senior guard J.D. Gall connected on one.

In the crucial fourth quarter, Lane hit a basket and 3 of 5 from the charity stripe. Senior forward Ashton Draper hit his only basket

of the game as did Brooks. Gall hit another basket and 2 of 2 from the line and senior guard Marcus Herman hit 2 of 4 charities.

Lane was leading scorer for Norton with 23 points on 2 of 7 from long range for 29 percent, 7 of 14 two-point tries for 50 percent and 9 of 21 overall for 43 percent. He also hit 3 of 5 free throws for 60 percent.

Braden McKee led Colby with 19 points.

Norton had just 9 turnovers and Colby lost the ball 20 times to the aggressive Blue Jay defense.

With the victory, Norton will take a 12-8 record into the substate tournament next week. Colby's record fell to 7-13.

The Norton junior varsity boys team lost to Colby 53-38.

Norton trailed 12-5 after one quarter before outscoring Colby 12-4 in the second quarter to take a 17-16 halftime lead.

A 14-11 third quarter in Norton's favor stretched the Blue Jay lead to 31-27 but Colby had a big fourth quarter, outscoring Norton 26-7 for the 15-point win.

Blue Jays lose to Plainville in rare Monday game

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Playing in a rare Monday night game turned out to be an off night for the Norton Community High School boys varsity basketball team who traveled to Plainville for their final Mid-Continent League contest of the season and suffered a 68-54 loss.

Despite out-rebounding the Cardinals, the Blue Jays could not keep up in the scoring department where they hit almost the same percentage but took fewer shots.

Norton trailed 22-12 after one quarter and Plainville outscored the Blue Jays 16-11 in the second period to take a 38-23 halftime advantage.

A6-point Norton third quarter compared to 14 more points by the Cardinals put the game out of reach with a 52-29 advantage for the home team.

The Blue Jays put together a 25-point fourth quarter but it was too little, too late as Plainville added 16 more points to their total.

"It is pretty simple," said Norton head boys basketball coach Doug Reusink.

"We are not going to beat good teams until we start defending people and play hard for more than one or two possessions at a time."

Norton junior guard Terrell Lane had a big scoring first half when he hit two baskets from three-point range and two twopointers for 10 of his game high 22 points.

Lane added two more baskets from beyond the arc and a free throw in the second quarter.

The Blue Jays' only points in the third quarter came on two baskets and a free throw by se-

nior forward Ashton Draper and another charity by Lane.

The fourth quarter saw sophomore forward Jordan Walmeier lead the way in scoring for Norton as he threw in 10 points on four baskets and two free throws after hitting only one basket in the previous three periods.

Freshman guard Jacob Brooks had also hit only one basket earlier but added two more along with a free throw.

Sophomore guard Dillon Mc-Conney hit his only two baskets of the game and Lane completed his 22-point night with two more baskets.

Lane's points came on 4 of 7 from beyond the arc for 57 percent accuracy, 4 of 12 two-point shots for 33 percent and 8 of 19 overall for 42 percent. He also hit 2 of 4 free throws for 50 percent. Wahlmeierended with 12 points
