"One of our priorities has always been to make people feel welcome in our store. We care about every customer that comes through that door," Boller said.

Mann said she enjoys working with customers the most.

When Destination Kitchen opened it employed two people-Mann and Boller. It currently employs eight part time people.

Boller and Mann took a class through Colby Community College before opening the store. They also have years of other experience to draw on.

She worked at Wilson Carter Printers, sold real estate and worked in court services.


"I did that for 19 and a half years," she said. She has two children and is married to Gail


