The course, taught by Tom Moorhous, AE 176 Introduction to Wind and Other Alternative Energy, will meet from 7-10 p.m. each evening in room 710.

"This college class will teach students some of the pros, cons and basics of wind, solar, geothermal, biofuels and other alternative energies," said Moorhous "Information regarding where

on March 16. Topics will include how to make solar cells, PV arrays and off-grid technology. He will provide information on installing controllers and inverters.

The Wednesday class will focus on biofuels, biomass and bioenergy. Topics will include creating fuel from landfill or animal waste. Possible applications include fueling a farm on methane gas from animal waste and converting and fueling a vehicle on discarded fast-food grease/biodiesel.
