(Continued from Page 1) The top three teams qualified to compete in the Daisy/Jaycees International Championships that will be held this year in Rogers, Ark., the home of Daisy, on Saturday and Sunday, July 3-4. Norton has won the international championship eight times, more than any other team in the world!

Placing fourth in Saturday's state shoot in Alma and missing a trip to the international championships by one point was the Phillips/Rooks Counties Team with a 2214 total.

Fifth place went to the Bullmasters Red from Nemaha and Jackson counties with a 2208, followed by Pottawatomie/Riley Counties Purple, 2148; and Flint Hills Jr. Shooters No.1, 2119.

Just seven points back in eighth place was the Norton Blue Team with a total score of 2112. Members of that team were Dalton Vanover, 12; Cameron Heikes, 12; Trenton Sprague, 11; Cody Campbell, 11 and Evan Chambers, 11. Their coaches were Mike Campbell and Cole Archer.

The Flint Hills Jr. Shooters No.2 finished ninth with a 2045, followed by Bullmasters White, 2043; Wyandotte Green, 1995; Norton Red, 1955; Flint Hills Jr. Shooters No.3, 1951 and Bullmasters Black, 1930.

Members of the Norton Red Team were Justis Posson, 10; Shane Cozad, 9; Dylan Goss, 9; Scott Sansom, 9; Adson Day, 8.

Shooters must be 8 to 14 years of age to be eligible to compete.

BB gun shooting consists of very precise, accurate marksmanship. Shooters fire their BB gun from a distance of 16 feet, 4.75 inches and the center of the target is the same size as a BB. Aperfect shot comes when the BB hits exactly on the center of the target. A bull's eye can be a few millimeters off center but not much.

Prone first firing position

Following the written test, the young marksmen opened fire on the range from the prone position, considered the easiest of the four.

The Norton Yellow Team marksmen did not shoot quite as well as they had hoped and were third with a 469 behind Bullmasters Red with a 475 and Phillips/ Rooks with a 473.

The standing position came next and is considered to be the hardest from which to shoot. Historically, Norton shooters have shot best from the tougher positions and Saturday proved to be no different. After a 445 in standing, the Blue Jays were leading overall and Wyandotte Gold had moved up to tie Phillips/ Rooks for second. Norton had a 914 total and the other two each had a 902. Bullmasters Red was fourth at that point with a 900.

The Norton shooters extended their overall lead by also winning the sitting position with a 474. Second best from that position was Derby with a 466 which allowed them to move into fourth

Second overall was Phillips/ Rooks, 21 total points behind Norton with a 465 in sitting. Bullmasters Red was in third after shooting a 463 in sitting and Wyandotte Gold was one point behind them after shooting a 460

Norton dropped off somewhat in the tougher kneeling position,

placing third with a 457. Phillips/ Rooks was best from that position with a 465 and Wyandotte Gold recorded a 463.

Neither Phillips/Rooks nor Wyandotte Gold picked up enough points, however, to overtake the leader, the Norton Yellow.

Norton Yellow finished with an 1845 shooting score, followed by Phillips/Rooks with an 1832, Wyandotte Gold with an 1825 and Derby with a 1795. Even though Phillips/Rooks was second high in shooting behind Norton, a lower written test dropped them into fourth overall.

Individual awards

In addition to all members of the top three teams each receiving a medal, the top three individuals in each shooting position as well as the top three aggregate shooters also received medals.

Three Norton marksmen received individual medals for their accuracy in firing a BB gun and one for a perfect written test of hunter safety knowledge.

Lane Archer of the Norton Yellow Team was the runner-up aggregate marksman out of all the shooters, missing the top score by just one point! Lane recorded a 96 in prone, 95 in standing, 95 in sitting and 93 in kneeling for a shooting total of 379 x 400.

Lane also received a second medal for placing runner-up in standing with his 95, which just missed the top score based on bull's eyes.

Zachary Bird of the Norton Yellow Team was right behind Lane in standing with a 92 that put him

James Berry of the Norton Yellow Team shot a 96 in sitting, which won him a third place medal based on bull's eyes and allowed him to edge teammate Erin Archer, who finished fourth with the same 96 score.

James won a second medal when he placed third in kneeling with a 96 and that was also based on bull's eyes. The top score was

Justis Posson of the Norton Red Team also shot a 96 in kneeling but finished out of the top three due to bull's eyes.

Dalton Vanover of the Norton Blue Team was one of five shooters who received a perfect 100 on the written test.

It's worthy of note that James Berry and Justis Posson had the seventh and eighth highest aggregate scores in the shoot. James shot a 375 and Justis a 370.

Practices are held every Wednesday evening and shooters are encouraged to also practice at home.
