She said it's early to tell exactly what effect the bill will have.

"We don't know," she said. Norton County Hospital Director Rich Miller agreed that it is too

early to know what the bill will do to health care.

"A form of health care reform is needed, but how it arrived raises a lot of skepticism and questions,"

Miller said there are some

positive things in the bill, such as coverage for the uninsured.

"It's the beginning of getting coverage for more people. We have seen our uninsured numbers go up," he said.

Miller's concern is the price.

"It has quite an expensive price tag. I think we're all concerned about the politics," he said.

According to Miller, the expansion of Medicaid is good, but he is concerned about how it will be funded.

On Jan. 1, Medicaid funding was reduced by 10 percent.

"In the 2010 fiscal year, it will impact us by \$70,000 in Medicaid

funding," he said. Miller said Norton County Hospital has an open-door policy when it comes to treating uninsured people, but sometimes payment never comes.

"We have to absorb that into our operating cost," he said.

Mickey said the correctional facility provides some equipment and meals, but in the financial crunch equipment has been cut back.

"We're still getting a sweet deal," she said.

"It's a great program. We love it, and we don't want to lose it," she said.

Mickey said it takes a lot of planning to keep projects planned for the inmates year-round. She coordinates ahead of time between the city and county needs. "We want them working, not

sitting idle," she said.

Mickey said there were growing pains in the beginning, but the crew has been an asset to the community.

"It was a learning process. There is nothing we would change now," she said.

"I think we've missed out on a great opportunity here," Shelton said.

"We have had to fight for it. It ended up ok, but it was tough," Mickey said.

The mayor offered her support to Norton as the meeting was wrapping up.

"If I can help, I will certainly give you all the support I can," she said.

At the end of the meeting, Steve Cole, parks supervisor, asked Mickey how she would feel if an
