Blue Jay track starts Monday with 48 athletes

The Norton track and field athletes include eight women letter winners and three state meet qualifiers from last season and 11 men lettermen and seven state qualifiers.

Norton will open the track season in the Kiwanis Junior Varsity Track Meet in Smith Center on Monday. Field events will begin at 4:30 p.m.

The 3200 meter run will also begin at 4:30 p.m. and will be followed by the other running events at 5 p.m. There will be no preliminaries.

Varsity competition for Norton will begin on Friday with the annual Norton Invitational Track Meet on the Jep Byrum Track at Travis Field.

Field events will begin at 3:30 p.m. and running events at 5:30 p.m. No preliminaries will be held and all events will be run as finals. All athletes may be entered.

Plaques will be awarded to the first and second place teams in both girls and boys divisions. Medals will be awarded for the first three places in each event.

Managers will be Vanessa Danesan, Rachel Shepard and David Cressler.

Coach Jones is a Logan native. A 1994 Logan High School graduate, he was the Class 1A state pole vault champion.

He attended Fort Hays State University in Hays on a track scholarship and pole vaulted for the Tigers. He was an all-conference performer and graduated in December, 1998.

He was head track coach and assistant football coach at Fowler High School for three years before moving to Norton. He was a teacher and assistant football and track coach in Norton for four years before becoming head track coach.

"As always, we are excited to begin track season," said coach

"We have a solid core of returning letter winners and state qualifiers.

"Our freshmen numbers are as high as we have seen in a long time, which is great. We look to these nine females and seven males from the freshmen class to add depth to our team.
