Very high winds prevailed during the entire meet but only the boys pole vault event was canceled.

Smith Center won the girls championship with 148.5 points, followed by Beloit, 88; Phillipsburg, 79; Norton, 70; Belleville, 69.5; Thayer Central, Neb., 64; Trego Community, 61.

Beloit was the boys champion with 149 points, followed by Thayer Central, Neb., 129; Norton, 90; Smith Center, 87; Phillipsburg, 73; Belleville, 46; Trego Community, 21.

"We bettered ourselves in many ways in this meet," said Norton head track and field coach Jason Jones.

"The wind was unbelievably strong and gusty all meet long but we competed right through it. On top of that, we registered many personal records!

"It is still very early and we are still moving some people around a little to figure out which combinations may give us our best chances of success late in the season.

"Our athletes competed hard. Some of them had some wonderful days and posted some great marks, given the conditions of the day.

"We continue to be proud of the effort our athletes are giving. We feel good about the overall direction of our team and we will continue to work hard to better ourselves in every event."

Sophomore Zach Hartwell was Norton's other gold medal winner. He was timed in 11:15.93 in the 3200 meter run.

Terrell Lane also earned two silver medals. He placed runnerup in the long jump with a leap of 20'2.5" and was second in the triple jump with a distance of 41'2". He also placed third in the 200 meter dash in 25.07.

Junior Ryan Blecha won a bronze medal in the shot put with a heave of 43'4" and he also placed fourth in the discus with a personal record throw of 129'8". Landon Hamel finished fourth in the 300 meter hurdles in 43.82 and sophomore Joe LeClair placed fourth in the 110 meter hurdles in 17.33.

Cole and Anderson were both unanimous choices.

Also honored on the first team were Logan sophomore Caley Greving and Thunder Ridge junior Sammy Krueger.

Receiving honorable mention were Samantha Tien, Logan sophomore; Alethea Bennett, Logan sophomore; Cheyenne Grauerholz, Thunder Ridge senior and Brittany Kirchhoff, Thunder Ridge senior.

"Alison Cole will surely go down in the Northern Valley history books as one of the very best to put on a Husky uniform," said Northern Valley girls head basketball coach Chuck Zimmerman.

"Alison led us in scoring with a 16 point average, in rebounding with 11 caroms per game and deflects with 142. Eighty-three of her deflects were blocks. If blocked shots were a statistic that was kept statewide, I believe she would have been among the state leaders.

"Alison not only led during the games but in practices as well as she demonstrated to her teammates that, if you want to be good, you have to practice hard each and every day.

"Christina will be remembered as a hard nosed player who left it all on the floor and did not spare her body in the process. "The best compliment given to Christina by another coach was that she drove to the basket harder than anyone they had played all season. Christina led us in assists with 94 and in three-point shooting with 36 for the season and a 38 percent accuracy average, one of the tops in our part of the state.

"Christina also led us in free throws made as well as percentage as her drives to the basket forced our opponents to foul. She made 67 charities at a 69 percent clip. She was second in our statistics in scoring with 13 points per game and in rebounds with five per contest. She was also second in steals.

"Christina will also go down as a practice player who pushed her teammates to excel as she and Alison realized this was the only way to become the team we needed to be if we were to be as successful as we were.

"Our third all-conference member was our junior point guard Staci Dole. Staci has improved her skills to the point that the other league coaches deemed her the best point guard in the conference and I believe they are correct. She handled the ball over 95 percent of the time in getting us into our offenses and did so with relatively few turnovers.

"Staci was runner-up in team assists with 74 and field goal accuracy at 46 percent. She was third in field goals made with 52, third in steals with 49 and third in free throws made with 49 and in accuracy with 57 percent. Staci was also a power on defense as she was fourth on our team in deflects."
