Blood Drive set for April 22 at Armory

As the days of spring and summer get longer and the temperature warms up, the American Red Cross is reaching out to find new donors for its life-saving team. Their contribution of a unit of blood at a Red Cross blood center or area blood drive can potentially extend the days and perhaps years of hospital patients in need.

Locally, donations can be made at the Norton Community drive on April 22 from noon to 6:30 p.m. at the National Guard Armory, 1200 N. State St.

"Not everyone can donate blood - and currently only five in every 100 eligible donors do," said Scott Caswell, CEO, Central Plains Region. "And those who can donate can give a unit (pint) of whole blood only every 56 days. With the advances in medical care and technology, more blood is needed daily."

Those in need of blood include accident or trauma victims as well as a daily list of scheduled surgeries at area hospitals - from heart surgery to joint replacements, organ transplants or premature

babies - cancer treatments and much more. Those in need can be family, friends, a Little Leaguer down the street, a 30-something jogger, or a senior citizen taking the dog for a daily walk.

How to Donate Blood:

Simply call 1-800-RED-CROSS (1-800-733-2767) or visit redcrossblood.org to make an appointment today. All blood types are needed to ensure the Red Cross maintains an adequate blood supply. A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Donors must be in general good health, weigh at least 110 pounds and be at least 17 years old (16 in Kansas with completed Parental Consent Form). New height and weight re-

strictions apply to donors younger than 19. Visit bloodisneeded.org to learn more.

City sewer rates based on average, not monthly usage

City utilities are billed once a month with some rates based off the average usage instead of the monthly usage.

Patty Rowh, billing clerk, said the sewer rate is based off the water average from November through April.

She said people who have not lived at their residence long enough to have a history are billed a basic rate until a history is established. Meters are read from April through November. They are not read December, January, February or March, but the average determines the bill. The last meter read for the year is in November, and the first for the year is in April.

Rowh said everyone who has a water bill also has a sewer bill. "Everybody that receives water has a sewer charge," she said.

Water and sewer are billed in cubic feet, meaning if two units are billed, 200 cubic feet of water was used.

Rowh said she can be reached at the city office, 877-5000, if there are any questions.
