to the needs of people through music that evening. That was another area of trust.

"We are thrilled to have such well known artists coming to this area. Normally people would have to travel quite a distance for this type of concert. This has been an incredible journey watching God do what He does best, be God," Clason said.

Clason felt compelled that this concert needed to be free of charge so all desiring to attend had no financial barrier standing in the way.

She again stepped out of her comfort zone and booked the concert not knowing where the financing would come from. Nearly 400 letters of support went out to local churches asking for aid both prayerfully and financially.

According to Clason, those who have responded have done so abundantly and we believe will be blessed for doing so.
