## MX racing season begins in Norton

The one mile track was first established in 2004. It was located 12 miles south of Norton. In 2006 the track was moved to the Ron Fisher property one mile east and one mile north of Norton. Norton MX is a member of the Nebraska Cornhusker Moto Cross Association (NCMA) and is run by Brad and Cristy Harding and Ron and Vicki Fisher. There are 22 different classes at this race with riders from all over in attendance. These riders compete to gain points against other riders from other associations.

Several local riders placed on Saturday. In the Open Outlaw class, former resident Garrett Hager placed second. In the Mini-Open, Garrett Otter of Norton also took second. In the fifth race, the 250 C division, Christopher Fisher, Norton, placed third against twenty riders. The sixth race was for the 65 6-8 division, Trey Kats of Prairie View took fourth. In the 65 9-11 class, Kelson Kats of Prairie View, placed second and Trenton Chisham of Norton placed seventh. During the seventh race in the 250 B class, Andy Nickell of Almena placed second. In the eighth race which was the Pee Wee 4-6 class, Ty Kats of Prairie View placed second. In the ninth race, Pee Wee 7-8, Trey Kats once again placed taking third.
