(Continued from Page 1) their car washes based on water usage," Leroux said. "We feel that this request was properly considered and researched and I would like to apologize for how long it took for us to give a final answer," he said. Grysck thanked the city for taking the time to research the request. "Thanks for considering my request. I don't necessarily agree, and that's my right," Grysck said. He said 30 percent of his water does not go into the sewer system and feels his sewer rates should

not be based off his water usage. "I use a lot of water that doesn't go into the sewer," he said. Grysck also asked about the power plant. "We have the power plant for a reason. I know with today's technology, power outages aren't as frequent as they used to be," he said. City Administrator Rob Lawson said the plant has needed maintenance for the last 30 years. "Right now, we have backup capability," Lawson said. "We haven't been able to carry the town in 30 years," said councilman Toby Kuhn.

Mayor David Corns said he is sorry that the power plant employees are unsure of the plant's future. "We offer our apologies to power plant staff. This has to be a stressful time for them," the mayor said. Leroux said the utility committee will discuss the power plant at their next meeting. In other council business: • Public Works Supervisor Dan Bainter reported on cleanup week. He said they took in almost double what they did last year. • Lawson thanked city crews for their work during cleanup week.

He also updated the council on a request from the Norton County Arts Council for the Moving Wall. The council discussed having the parks crew set up bleachers for the event. Lawson said his contract has his evaluations in May and in October. He said the council should fill out the forms by the next council meeting. • Jeff Otter reported on the last finance committee meeting. He said they met with the Norton County Commissioners to discuss the inmate work crew. He said the county has agreed to take charge of the program for the first six months in order to

have the inmates work on the old ambulance building. Lawson said he hopes the city will take over the program in November. • Donna Foley discussed the last safety committee meeting. She said the police department has their new Ford Explorer. The Crown Victoria was traded in, and the money from that will be put towards putting equipment in the Explorer. A motion was made to have city staff install the equipment in the police department's Explorer. Vote taken, motion passed. • Kim Snyder said the parks committee met at Elmwood Park to examine playground equip-

ment and ground covering. She said interviewing will begin for the maintenance I position. The next city council meeting will be held May 12 at 5:30 p.m. in the city office. The next personnel committee meeting will be held May 10 at 4:30 p.m., the next parks committee meeting will be held May 10 at 6 p.m., the next public works committee meeting will be held May 17 at 5:30 p.m., the next utility committee meeting will be held May 17 at 6 p.m., the next finance committee meeting will be held May 17 at 6:30 p.m. All meetings are held in the city office and are open to the public.
