sweet cherries unwashed in the refrigerator up to 10 days. Store sour cherries unwashed in the refrigerator. They are best used in 2-3 days.

Rainier cherries are red with a creamy white coloring. They may have slight discoloration and brown spotting. This indicates they are higher in sugar content. Avoid decaying fruit. They are sweeter than Bing cherries and have a slightly shorter season.

Sour cherries are a favorite in

pies, preserves, syrups, sauces and pair well with meats. Dried cherries make tasty snacks and add color to salads, stews, and rice dishes.

Cherries are fat free, sodium free, cholesterol free and good sources of vitamin C and potassium.
