Marcus shot a 45-41-86 to rank No.7 among medalists. All members of the top two teams plus the next best five golfers qualified for state competition.

Norton placed seventh as a team. Team champion was Phillipsburg with a 341. Minneapolis placed second with a 359 to also qualify for the state tournament.

Third place team was Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays with a 379, followed by Goodland, 380; Ellsworth, 388; Beloit, 394; Norton, 399; Smith Center, 410.

The other three members of the Norton foursome and their scores were: junior Cole Archer, 51-46-97; senior Connor Pfannenstiel, 53-48-101 and freshman Andrew Ellis, 55-60-115.

Also playing for the Blue Jays and their scores were: freshman John Risewick, 55-62-117 and junior Ashley Millan, 67-65-132.

Marcus Herman also qualified for state tournament competition in last season's regional with a No.8 medalist performance and competed in Wichita where he placed in the upper half of the

Marcus follows older brothers Preston Herman who competed for Norton in the state tournament in 2008, missing a medalist by two strokes and Aaron Herman, who competed in the state tournament as an individual in 2002 and as a member of the Norton team in 2003.

back further, father Joe Herman was a member of Norton's state championship golf team in 1975, the Blue Jays' third place state team in 1976 and also competed in the state tournament in 1974.
