Plan Farm Service meetings

The Norton County Farm Service Agency will be holding informational meetings for the 2010 County Committee Election process. The County Committee Election informational meetings are scheduled for June 8 at 10 a.m. and June 10 at 1 p.m. in the Norton County Farm Service Agency Office, Conference Room.

The informational meetings are being held to inform producers and the community about the Norton County Committee Election process and deadlines. One of Farm Service Agency's responsibilities is to conduct County Committee elections in an open manner that ensures accountability. Farm Service Agency will

provide local organizations representing socially disadvantaged groups with detailed information about the COC election process. The Local Administrative Area (LAA) County Committee Election this year will be held in LAA #1. LAA #1 includes the east half of Norton County. The Norton County Committee LAA #1 seat is currently held by Donald Lowry, vice-chairperson.

Nomination sign-up begins June 15 and runs through Aug. 2. COC Election Ballots will be mailed to all eligible voters on November 5. COC Election Ballots must be signed and returned to the Norton County Farm Service Agency Office by

Dec. 6. Reminder, specific signature authority will be checked on joint operations and entities. Reminder, the use of power of attorney forms are not a valid source of signature authority for the COC Election process.

Under represented farmers and ranchers are encouraged to step up and participate in their county's COC election process. Producers will notice posters and announcements displayed in businesses, churches and other public places.

If you have questions concerning your eligibility to vote, please contact the Norton County Farm Service Agency.
