These outfits will be modeled at 7 p.m. Saturday at the 4-H Public Fashion Revue at the 4-H Building in Norton.

The theme of the fashion revue is "Paint Your Own Fashion." 4-H members invite you to be present for their fashion revue.

The garments and articles that the 4-H'ers have made and modeled will be on display at the 4-H Building during fair week.

Students sell animals, food

Two of the more traditional activities at most county fairs are the livestock and food sales. And it's no different for Norton County.

The 4-H Youth Food Sale will be held at the 4-H building at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, July 27, and the 4-H and FFA Livestock Sale will be held Thursday, July 28, at 6 p.m. in the Livestock Barn.

The youngsters can sell either one animal or one food item.

The 4-H and FFA students really look forward to this opportunity and the businesses and individuals in the county really show their interest for these many events.

Each 4-H member can receive a premium amount on one food item. 4-H'ers can make and sell other items but money from those will be donated to the Norton County 4-H Council for use in conducting 4-H programs,

awards, various events, trips, leader training and more.

The livestock sale will feature market steers, lambs, hogs and meat goats.

This year the order of sale is beef, hogs, goats and sheep. There will be no monetary limit placed on any animal regardless of sale order or ribbon color.

The livestock sale committee offers options for buyers to purchase an animal to keep or butcher or the buyer can offer the animal back for resale to the sale committee.

Both sales offer the opportunity for young people to showcase their project to the public and offer their appreciation to the buyer for their attendance.

Local Auctioneers Monte Jessup, Duane McEwen, Donald McMullen and Lance Kinderknecht will be donating their services to the sales.
