now living in Pennsylvania.

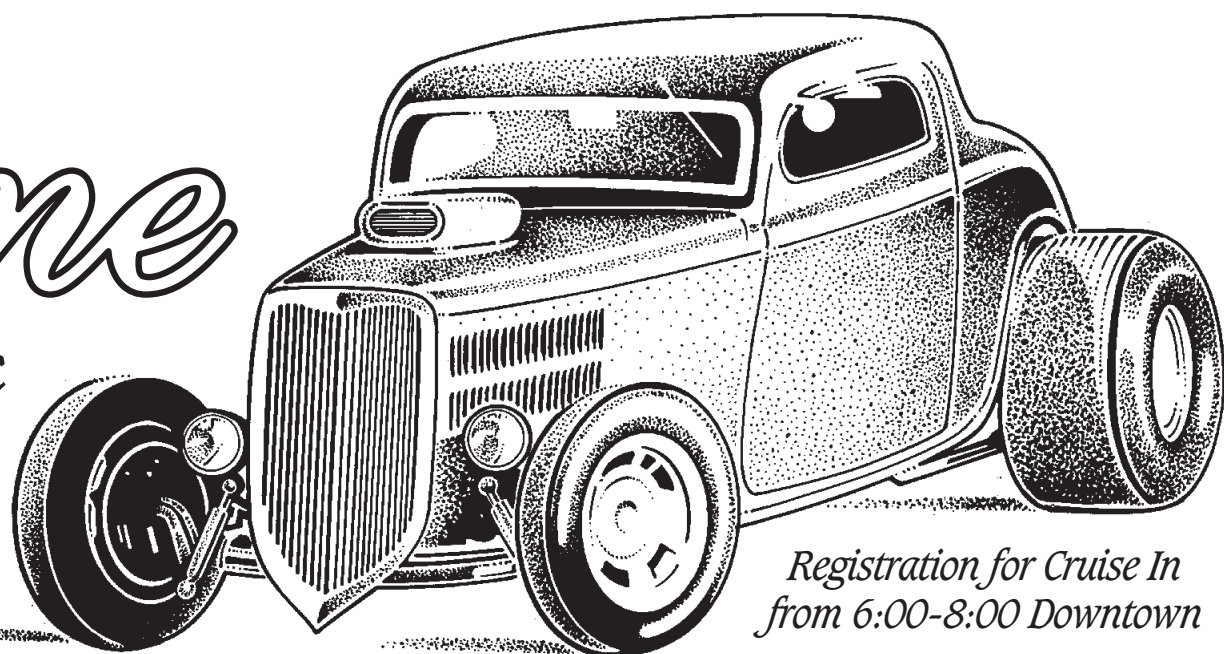
