## Two couples volunteer their services by being camp hosts at the lake

The Prairie Dog State Park has several beautiful camping sites. Two families have volunteered to spend their time being camp hosts. The biggest part of their duties run from Mid April to mid October when the water is shut off.

Angie Hager and Andrew Knuth of Norton are in their first year as the camp hosts for the Shady Rest camping area as well as for the cabins. Angie is the Norton Head Start Director and teacher which is full time during the school year and works at the park part time as a seasonal worker in the summer. Andrew is a full time truck driver for Swine Transportation Service (STS) out of Long Island.

Their duties include trash pick up, checking to be sure all campers have current park permits, re-coding and cleaning of the cabins just name a few of their duties. During the off season they check things to be sure all is well with the camping areas and cabins. Andrew has recently started offering his services to dump the waste wells for the campers.

When asked why they do this Angie said," I like being out here, it is relaxing and I like meeting new and different people from all over." She did say that the weather did spook her a couple of times this summer and she did go to her home but the rest of the time she, Andrew and her two sons spend
