

Construction work planned for K-383 at county line

Hi-Plains Sand Inc., of Kanopolis, will begin a road construction project this week on K-383 Highway in Decatur County.

A seal will be placed along K-383 from the west city limits of Jennings to the Norton/Decatur County line - approximately 7 miles in length.

During daylight hours, traffic will be reduced to one lane through the work zone and guided by a pilot car operation. Travelers should plan on a short delay of 15

minutes or less due to the road work. KDOT urges motorists to be alert, watch for work zone warning signs and its workers while driving through a road construction zone.

"The seal operation should be complete by August 19, weather permitting," explains KDOT Area Two Engineer Eric Oelschlagler. The estimated cost of the seal is \$217,225.

"As always, we ask that the public exercise caution while

driving through this and any other work zone on our Kansas highways," reminds KDOT Public Affairs Manager Kristen Brands. "Please slow down, pay attention to the workers and signs within a construction zone."

Heft and Sons, LLC., of Greensburg, is scheduled to begin a road construction project on Wednesday, August 18 to seal US-83 Highway in Logan and Thomas Counties.

A seal will be placed along US-

83 from the US-40 Junction north to the US-24 Junction - approximately 19 miles in length.

During daylight hours, traffic will be reduced to one lane through the work zone and guided by a pilot car operation. Travelers should plan on a short delay of 15 minutes or less due to the road work. KDOT urges motorists to be alert, watch for work zone warning signs and its workers while driving through a road construction zone.

"The seal operation should be complete by August 24, weather permitting," explains KDOT Area Four Construction Manager Roy Meier of the KDOT Oakley office. The estimated cost is \$508,474.

"As always, we ask that the public exercise caution while driving through this and any other work zone on our Kansas highways," reminds KDOT Public Affairs Manager Kristen Brands. "Please slow down, pay attention to the workers and signs within a

construction zone."
