

Races held over weekend

The June Norton Motocross races were canceled but were re-scheduled for August 21-22. A total of 178 riders ran in 12 races on August 21.

The first race was the Open Outlaw Class where former Norton resident Garrett Hager placed first and Norton's Jeremy Sproul placed 9th.

In the second race, Hunter Kiburz of Lexington, Neb. won the Mini-Open and Shaun Crawford of North Platte won the PIT Bike race.

In the third race, Abby Davignon of Bogue took first in the Women B class and Tammie Hutchison of Wichita took first in the Women C class.

The fourth race had three classes. In the Vet A Class David Blau of Oberlin placed sixth. In the Vet B Class, the only rider was Andy Coleman of Lincoln, Neb. In the Vet C Class, David Burmaster of Oberlin placed fifth.

The fifth race was the 250C Class. Braden Morgan of Phillipsburg took fourth and Christopher Fisher of Norton placed seventh. This was the biggest race of the day with a total of 19 riders.

Race six had two classes. The 65 6-8 Class had Trey Kats of Prairie View taking fourth. In the 65 9-11 Division Trenton Chisham of Norton placed 10th and Kyleana D. Blau of Oberlin finished 12th.

In the seventh race, the 250 A Class. Craig Roysse of Junction City won. In the 250 B class Andy Nickel of Almena took fourth.

In the eighth race, Pee Wee 4-6 class, Ty S. Kats of Prairie View placed second. John Burmaster of Oberlin took sixth and Norton's Roy Able finished seventh.
