A Norton man was injured in a vehicle accident early Saturday morning. Joshua Michael Asbury, 17, was eastbound on U.S. 36 at 1:30 a.m. driving a 1999 Ford F150 pickup. At mile marker 105.9 or approximately 10 miles west of Norton, he drifted into the south shoulder and rolled. His vehicle came to rest on the roadway facing northwest. Asbury was transported to the Norton County Hospital. There was significant damage to the vehicle and safety belts were engaged, according to the Kansas Highway Patrol.

Shane and Jenny Miller were gracious enough to allow their home to be included in the Norton County Arts Council Home Tour. Their home is located west of Norton on Highway 36.

The house was built by Kennis Mann on approximately five acres of land. In the fall of 2008, the Millers purchased the home from Norton Fricky.

The Millers' were currently living in a rental and were desperately looking for a place to call their own. They heard about this home and eventually bought it. "Buying this house was a really big deal for us," said Jenny.

The house is a tri-level with an elevated entrance. The exterior

of the home is tastefully done in wood and stone with entrance stairs leading to the front door and a deck. There is a double car garage that allows entrance to the lower level of the house.

A tiled foyer greets you when you enter the home. On your right is a living room with a stone fireplace, cathedral beamed ceilings and a large window that faces the East. To the front of you there is a small stairway that leads to the upper level that has the kitchen and family dining area overlooking the living room in a loft fashion. Immediately to your right there are stairs that lead to the lower level of the house. In this area you will find a laundry room, bathroom and the garage entrance, take a few more steps down and you are in a family room.

The kitchen opens up to a sun room that has double doors opening to a deck that faces south. The sun room can also be used as a

more formal dining room but the family still prefers the kitchen island to have meals. "Shane is very insistent that we all sit down to our meals as a family," said Jenny.

The bedrooms are also located on this level. There are three bedrooms and a bathroom with a heated floor.

When asked what improvements the family had made Jenny said that they did re-do the lower level. "The living room and bathroom were the only rooms that needed updated," she said.

Jenny works at Farm Bureau Financial Services and is the Norton Junior High Cheer Coach. Shane is the counselor at the Norton Community High School as well as the head football coach for the Norton Junior High School Blue Jays. They have two children, Juliana and Kendall.

Jenny said, "We live in our home."
