 "The committee is made up of individuals and organizations from throughout the county. The only goal we have is to give our Vietnam veterans the honor and respect they deserve. We have been meeting since February to make sure we do everything we can to make the week of Sept. 23-27 special for our veterans and our community."

One of the requirements to host the Wall is to have someone at the Wall 24 hours a day. These people will assist visitors in locating names on the wall, making rubbings of names and helping at the hospitality tent. Jon Wyatt is the director of the Norton Legion Riders who, along with other volunteers, are helping while the Wall is in Norton. Mr. Wyatt and his wife, Eve, are also on the organizational committee. They are coordinating volunteers

into four-hour shifts with four people per shift. The Christian Motorcycle Association from Phillipsburg has been invited to help during the Wall's stay.

Site preparation is of utmost importance. The Wall must have a perfectly level base to rest on during its stay in a town. The Norton Lions Club has constructed a platform on the east lot of Prairie Land Electric. The utility company is providing lighting and electricity to the site.

As the wall moves from town to town, it is often escorted by state troopers or local law enforcement officers. As it passes through towns, even when it is not planning a stop, local citizens gather by the roadsides and on overpasses to wave flags and pay tribute to the Wall. The Wall is coming to Norton from Iowa. Mrs. Erlenbusch said she

is thrilled to know several area schools plan to visit the Wall while it is in Norton. So far, over 800 students have requested a time to visit the Wall. If you would like to volunteer to help at the Wall, call Jon Wyatt at 785-202-0282.

Opening ceremonies will be held at 7 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 23. Families of fallen soldiers will receive special recognition and will take part in a wreath laying ceremony. At 7 p.m. Friday evening the Norton American Legion will conduct a service to honor the Vietnam Veterans. At 7 p.m. Saturday evening the Vietnam Veterans of America will host a special Prisoner of War (POW)/Missing In Action (MIA) candlelight ceremony and at 7 p.m. Sunday evening, the Norton County Ministerial Alliance will have an interdenominational church service.

Other items reported by the City Administrator: Public Works department is in the process of getting caught up on sidewalk and gutter repair; brick street holes are being repaired; street sealing will start soon; Parks and Cemetery are making repairs to the sprinkler system at Pine Ridge Park; backfilling started along the water main from EMS building to the new church; the Code Inspector has been busy with property clean-up; a pump has been replaced at the sewer plant; safety switches have been installed at the water plant's acid tanks; emergency safety kit has been made and will be stored at the street shop and the water plant is almost complete, Chris Miller will make a report when the project is finished.

A thank you was given by Jeff Otter to the Smokin' in the Barn committee for the nice barbecue event. "Participation was down this year at the event but there were a number of other activities around at the same time. I was glad to see the Telegram gave us front page coverage," said Tony Grysych, a member of the committee.

The master plan includes a 24 hour credit card fueling station, a lighted wind cone at the North end of the runway, GPS landing indicators for nighttime GPS navigation, water and electric line upgrades throughout the hangar area.

There was discussion about a request from Economic Development that was tabled until the council received more information.
