Blue Jays win Homecoming game, 46-0, against Plainville

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Lucas Melvin's Norton Community High School football team displayed a balanced offense and gang-tackling defense in winning their Homecoming game 46-0 over Plainville on Friday night at Travis Field.

The Blue Jays scored one of two times they had the ball in the first quarter, then totaled 32 points in the second quarter to lead 39-0 at halftime and leave no doubt about the eventual winner.

plays to score after the opening kickoff of the second half, Norton led 46-0 and the continuous scoreboard clock rule was implemented. The Norton junior varsity completed the game against the Plainville varsity.

The "Blue Swarm" defense allowed only three first downs by the Plainville offense while the Norton varsity was on the field.

Norton rolled up 225 yards on the ground and 110 yards passing for 335 total yards of offense. The Blue Jay ground game averaged 8 yards per carry while the defense limited the Cardinals to a 2.68 yard average. During the three quarters played by the Norton varsity defense, they did not allow Plainville past the 50-yard-line!

Norton quarterback Spencer Shirk was a very accurate passer. sophomore Alex Riggins, 270 He completed 10 of 13 passes for 77 percent.

The Norton varsity punted only one time. The Blue Jays had no fumbles lost and no pass interceptions and 68 yards in penalties.

Norton kicked off and Plainville got a 13 yard run on their first play from scrimmage and didn't get another until the second quarter. Plainville punted to Norton and the Blue Jays had their only threeand-out of the game. Terrell Lane punted into the end zone for the only Norton punt for the Blue Jay varsity.

After a Plainville three-andout, Norton drove for their first touchdown. Mixing passes by quarterback Spencer Shirk to Dakota Dreher and Brett Terrell and runs by Lane, the Blue Jays got into the end zone with 2:55 left in the first quarter. Lane ran the final four yards and Caleb Laughlin on 10 carries for an 8.8 yard averbooted the extra point.
