School football team has had some close games with Smith Center in recent years but has been unable to beat the Redmen since 2003 until Friday night at Travis Field in Norton when head coach Lucas Melvin's Blue Jays put together a dominating 41-20 victory!

Norton's last win over Smith Center was by a 17-8 score in Smith Center and the Redmen started a nation-leading win streak after that. The streak reached 79 straight victories and was broken in the Class 2A state finals last season in a 20-12 overtime loss to Centralia.

This season, the Redmen have moved up to Class 3A. They lost 19-14 to an outstanding Phillipsburg eleven in week two and entered this Friday's game 3-1 for the season. After the big win, the Blue Jays are 5-0.

It was evident from the start of the game, that Norton was fighting mad over the previous losses and determined to win this year.

After kicking off to the visitors and forcing the famed Smith Center wishbone offense to a threeand-out, Norton moved quickly down the field to score. Senior tailback, defensive back Terrell Lane returned the Redman punt to the Norton 42.

It took just three plays for Norton to score. Lane ran 43 yards to the Smith Center 15, running back Trey Millan tacked on 5 yards and Lane avoided several would-be tacklers as he waltzed 10 yards into the end zone! Caleb Laughlin's kick gave Norton the early 7-0 lead with 8:57 left in the first period.

Kale Newell returned Laughlin's mixing passes with their usually exclusive run game. The strategy paid off as quarterback Alex Hobelmann completed an 18-yard pass to Nathan Cox, who made a diving catch on the Norton 14.
