



Norton Junior Varsity wins

The Norton Community High School junior varsity football team won a hard fought 16-8 victory over Smith Center on Monday in Smith Center.

Norton opened the game by forcing Smith Center to punt after three downs. The Blue Jays then put together a nice drive but it stalled on the Redmen 30-yard line.

Some Norton turnovers created good field position for Smith Center. After the first turnover, Norton's defense held, but after the next one, the Redmen had a short drive for a touchdown. The half ended with Smith Center leading 8-0.

The young Blue Jays came out moving the ball on the ground after intermission but scored their first touchdown on a 37 yard pass from quarterback Dalton Miller to wide receiver Jordan Wahlmeier. Running back Trey Millan scored two extra points by driving up the middle to tie the score at 8-all.

The Blue Jay defense spoiled a Redmen drive with 5:34 left in the game, stopping them on the 20-yard line. The Norton offense then converted several big third downs and scored on a Jacob Brooks run. Miller connected with Wahlmeier for a two point conversion, making the score 16-8 with 3:01 left.

After the kickoff, the Norton defense held the Redmen, took over possession of the pigskin with 1:45 left, made a crucial first

down and ran out the clock for the 16-8 victory!

"Our offensive and defensive lines did a great job tonight," said Norton assistant football coach Jeremy Hawks. "If we had played with a little more fire and focus, we probably would have scored a couple more times but overall our young men played well."

"Anytime you can hold an offense to one score you are playing well defensively."

"I am very proud of our young men. They continue to get better and compete well each week."

The final game of the season for the Norton junior varsity football team will be at 5:30 p.m. on Monday when they play Goodland at Travis Field in Norton.

Northern Valley Husky football team defeated by Victoria

The Northern Valley Husky football team took on Victoria at Victoria last Friday, losing the battle 46-0.

In the first quarter, Victoria scored four touchdowns. Dalton Dreiling, tallied on runs of 11 and 7 yards and a 16 yard interception return. Dreiling then ran in 2 extra points. After the next two scores, the extra points failed. The fourth touchdown was made by Kameron

Dinkel on a 65 yard run. He also ran it in for the extra points. This ended the first quarter, 28-0, in Victoria's favor.

Victoria scored three touchdowns in the second quarter. Cody Scheck ran 7 yards for the first touchdown followed by a failed run. The second Victoria touchdown came from Dreiling with an 8 yard run and a failed extra point attempt. The last touchdown of the game also went to Victoria when Dinkel ran a 35 yard touch-

down and the pass attempt for the extra points failed. Making the final score 46-0.

Head Coach Chuck Fessenden said, "Victoria pretty much dominated us on both sides of the ball. They were much stronger. We were playing without three starters and it definitely showed. We did have a little success throwing to Dusty Eagleburger and we ran the ball better in the second quarter."

Northern Valley's Eagleburger was the leading Husky rusher. He

had 11 carries for 26 yards, followed by Austin Herman, 10 carries for 31 yards; Jordan Baird, 1 carry for minus 3 yards and Calen Bach, 3 carries for minus 1 yard.

Herman passed the ball 9 times, 3 of which were completed to Eagleburger for a total of 61 yards. Herman also punted the ball 3 times for 68 yards.

The leading Husky tackler was Herman with 5 solos, 4 assists, 9 total, followed by Bach, 6 solos, 1 assist for 7; Eagleburger, 3 solos,

4 assists for 7; Zachary Vincent, 2 solos, 4 assists, 6 total; Matt Dole, 2 solos, 2 assists, 4 total; Hunter Chandler, 1 solo, 3 assists, 4 total. Baird, 3 solos; Dillon Hogan had 2 solos and Ian Vincent, 1 solo.

The next action will be tonight against Thunder Ridge on the Northern Valley home field at 7 p.m.
