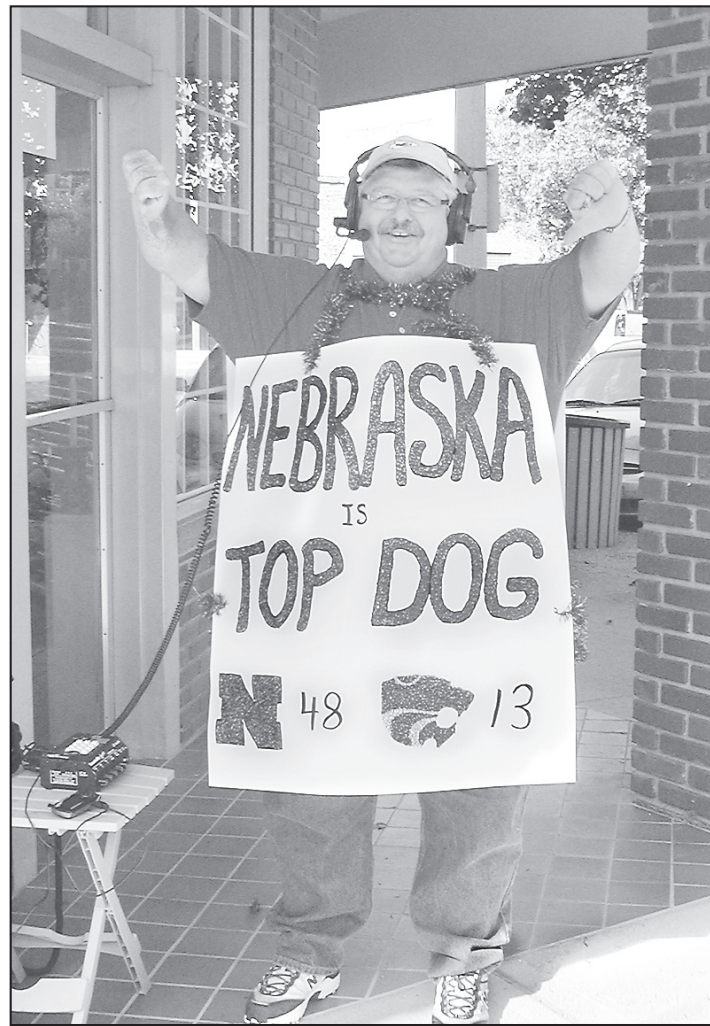


## Good sport for a good cause
