Norton fumbled the ball away to TMP late in the third quarter and the Monarchs scored with 7:36 left in the game on a 15 yard pass from Hammeke to Nathan Zimmerman. Hammeke passed to Zimmerman for 2 extra points, making the final score 63-14.

# **Next action**

Norton is now a perfect 7-0 for the season and the Blue Jays will play their third and final District game this Thursday in Phillipsburg with a 7 p.m. kickoff.

Phillipsburg also had a perfect record until last Friday when they lost 49-28 at Goodland. The Panthers have defeated some outstanding teams this season, including Smith Center, Ellis and Oakley.

"They always play good against us," said coach Melvin. "They'll be ready to play and we'll have to play our best game of the season to beat them.

"They have a lot of weapons. They have an outstanding quarterback and two good tailbacks and their offensive and defensive line is big and powerful.

"Phillipsburg has good players everywhere, including on special teams.

'They run an option-type offense that we have not seen this year."

Coach Melvin said that junior running back Trevor Smith is "really fast and dangerous."
