

loit and Hill City remaining. Beloit, who edged Norton 42-35 the week before, easily handled Hutch Trinity 38-12 on Friday night in Beloit. The Trojans rolled up 524 yards rushing on 67 carries for a 7.8 yard average.

Lane Koster led Beloit with 286 yards on 30 carries for 9.5 yards per carry and Robert Ludwig gained 130 yards on 13 carries for an average of 10 yards.

Beloit (10-2) will travel to Conway Springs (12-0) on Friday to decide the state championship
