## Norton junior receives second straight MCL volleyball honor

Erin Terrell, 5'9" junior left side hitter from Norton Community High School, has received honorable mention for the second straight year on the Mid-Continent League All-League Volleyball Team.

"Erin received more votes for all-league this year than last year when she also made honorable mention," said Norton head volleyball coach Peggy Cox.

"Towards the end of the season, she started mixing up her hits, both in types of attacks and placement.

"This was her first year for play-

ing all the way around. She passed a 1.92/3.00 and also had the most digs on our team with 123 (1.98/gm.).

Erin served 84 percent and had 3.42 kills per game. She was 41 percent on kills with 212 kills out of 517 total hits.

## Football playoffs continue

Over the weekend, the number of area high school football teams continuing in the state playoffs was reduced to two with only Beloit and Hill City remaining.

Beloit, who edged Norton 42-35 the week before, easily handled Hutch Trinity 38-12 on Friday night in Beloit. The Trojans rolled up 524 yards rushing on 67 carries for a 7.8 yard average.

Lane Koster led Beloit with 286 yards on 30 carries for 9.5 yards per carry and Robert Ludwig gained 130 yards on 13 carries for an average of 10 yards.

Beloit (10-2) will travel to Conway Springs (12-0) on Friday to decide the state championship

contestant from the West. The winner will play the winner of the Silver Lake (11-1) vs. Rossville (9-3) game for the state championship.

Conway Springs overpowered Smith Center 56-6 on Saturday in Smith Center.

The Redmen had 304 yards of offense but five turnovers cost them. Smith Center, who knocked off previously unbeaten Scott City a week ago, ended the season 8-3. Their other two losses were in regular season to Norton and Phillipsburg.

In Eight-Man Division I, Hill City gained revenge for their only previous loss this season when they outscored a visiting Osborne squad 48-24 on Friday night.

The Ringnecks had earlier lost the Mid-Continent League eight-man title when the Bulldogs defeated them 50-38.

This time, Hill City slowed Osborne's rushing attack, allowing them only 195 yards. Meanwhile, the Ringnecks had 457 yards rushing on 64 tries for a 7.1 yard average. Hill City quarterback Reggie Joran picked up 269 yards on 44 carries for a 6.1 yard average.

This Saturday, Hill City (11-1) will play Madison (12-0) at 3 p.m. in Newton for the state championship.

The Eight-Man II state championship game will be played at the same location between Baileyville (12-0) and Otis-Bison (12-0) with kickoff set for 11 a.m.

## Junior Jays football is one for two

The first football game of the season for the Norton Junior High boys took place on September 2 and was against Phillipsburg on the Blue Jay home playing field. It ended in a Blue Jay loss of 20-12.

The Blue Jays ended the first quarter 6-0. In the second quarter, the Jays got 6 more while the Panthers scored 14 ending the first half at 14-12. No points were put on the board in the third quarter and Phillipsburg scored once more to end the game 20-12.

The leading Blue Jay rusher was Derick Campbell, 19 carries, 95 yards followed by Jared Tallent, 5 carries, 26 yards; Kendall Miller, 2 carries, 3 yards and Conor Cox, 2 carries, 5 yards.

Quarterback Kendall Miller, made 7 passing attempts, completing 2 for 14 yards. Tallent caught one for 5 yards and Campbell, one for 9 yards.

Leading tackler was Miller with 6 followed by Wyatt Harting, 6; Campbell, 5; Brevon Sondergaard, 3; Tallent, 3; Christian Boser, 3. Caysean Campbell, 3; Cox, 3; Jordan Karnopp, 3; Kobie Unterseher, 2 and Riley Hager, 1.

Head coach Shane Miller said, "This was a difficult loss as we

did a lot of good things in the ball game. We let two big plays get away from us after we jumped out to a 12-0 lead. We relaxed a little bit on the kick off return and allowed Phillipsburg a 75 yard return. In the second quarter we had one breakdown of a defensive assignment and Phillipsburg broke a 71 yard run. We were pressing late in the ball game and threw an interception that gave them good field position for their final score. We are going to have to be able to convert on our PAT attempts as they always are critical points and really could have changed the outcome of the ball game. We will go back to work and see how the players respond to the challenge."

**Norton Junior High vs. Ellis**  
The second game came on September 9 when the Junior Jays took on Ellis at Ellis and had a successful game, winning 42-20.

The Jays dominated the first quarter 16-6. They continued their roll by scoring 20 more points in the second quarter where Ellis scored zero. The score stood at 36-6. The Blue Jays were the only team to score in the third quarter, leaving the tally at 42-6. In the final quarter of play, Ellis scored 14 points and the game

ended in the Blue Jays' first win, 42-20.

Head Coach Shane Miller said, "It was nice to dominate the game after the first game's tough loss to Phillipsburg. We responded like I thought we would and had a good week of practice. The players came out 'hungry' for a win. When you play aggressive, good things are going to happen. The coaches have been stressing to the players to play with more emotion and have fun. That finally showed up in this game; now we just need to continue with the same enthusiasm.

"Ellis has some decent speed on their team and we were able to contain that throughout most of the game. We need to still work on consistent play. I felt there were times in the fourth quarter where we relaxed.

"It was also nice for our young players to get valuable varsity experience in the second half. The eighth graders did a nice job of getting up in the game and turning the game over to the second teamers."

The leading rusher in this game was Derick Campbell, 14 carries, 176 yards followed by Jared Tallent, 4 carries, 65 yards; Gavin Lively, 11 carries, 31 yards; Kend-
