RESOLUTION NO. 2010-20 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPPING OF A MEDICAL CLINIC ADJACENT TO THE NORTON COUNTY HOSPITAL; AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE COSTS THEREOF. WHEREAS, K.S.A. 19-4616, as amended (the "Act") authorizes the Board of

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 19-4616, as amended (the "Act") authorizes the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") of Norton County, Kansas (the "County"), to issue and sell revenue bonds for the purpose of purchasing, leasing or otherwise acquiring an existing hospital building or buildings and improving, remodeling or repairing and equipping the same, or for the purpose of constructing, equipping and furnishing an addition to an existing county hospital; and

WHEREAS, Norton County Hospital, a county hospital duly organized by Norton County, Kansas under the laws of the State of Kansas (the "Hospital"), desires to finance a portion of the costs of acquiring, constructing and equipping a medical clinic adjacent to the Hospital in the amount of \$2,500,000 (the "Project"), and to pay related expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the revenue bonds in one or more series proposed to be issued by Norton County, Kansas (the "Issuer") in the amount of \$2,240,000 (the "Broject") and to require a portion of the amount of \$2,240,000 (the "Broject") and the series proposed to be issued by Norton County, Kansas (the "Issuer") in the amount of \$2,240,000 (the "Bonds") to provide funds for the foregoing purposes, all as provided by the Act; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby found and determined that it is necessary and advisable and will promote the general health and welfare of the County and its inhabitants to proceed with the Project and the offering, issuance and delivery of revenue bonds of the Hospital in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$2,240,000.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMIS-SIONERS OF NORTON COUNTY, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. Declaration of Necessity. The Board hereby declares its intent to acquire and construct the Project at an estimated cost of \$2,500,000.

SECTION 2. Financing Authority. The Board intends to issue the Bonds in an amount of not to exceed \$2,240,000 to pay a portion of the costs of the Project and financing costs related thereto, with the balance of the Project costs to be paid from other available funds. The Bonds shall be limited obligations of the County payable solely from the sources and in the manner as provided in the Bond Resolution to be adopted by the County to authorize the issuance of the Bonds and prescribe the terms and conditions thereof.

SECTION 3. Reimbursement Authority. Bonds authorized pursuant to this Resolution may be used to reimburse project expenditures made on or after the date which is 60 days before the date of this Resolution, pursuant to Treasury Regulation 1.150-2.

SECTION 4. Publication of Resolution of Intent. This resolution shall be published once each week for three consecutive weeks in the official county newspaper. No Bonds will be issued until all publications have been made, as provided by the Act.

SECTION 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption.

The heartbeat of an attitude of gratitude is found in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-17, "Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

The great Communitarian Matthew Henry writes, "Here we have short exhortations that will not burden our memories, but will be of great use to direct the motions of our hearts and lives. This is a duty of great importance." These series of brief, staccato commands indicate the heartbeat of Christian living. Today's key text gives the marks of a genuine church that is surrendered to the Headship of Christ. The world view is not to praise God. The lie of the devil says that the Lord is not aware of nor concerned about your present circumstance.

Gratitude is the mark of a growing Christian. For example: Babies are not born being able to express gratitude. You can walk a colicky baby for several hours throughout the night. When you lay the baby down, he will not express thanksgiving, because he can't, he is a baby. But as the child begins to grow, good parents train the child to say "thank you" and as the child continues to grow, he is expected to show gratitude by the way he lives. Born again Christians must learn how to live a life of gratitude to the Lord and to all who serve Him.

There was a black Negro preacher who knew that his life was to express gratitude. This great man of God was a leper in the once "National Hospital of Lepers" in Carville, Louisiana. Leprosy caused him to become a cripple, deformed and blind. Yet he was very cheerful and thankful. He sang hymns of praise and greatly inspired all the other lepers who suffered the same health problems that he did. A note of thanksgiving was always dominate in his prayers. An old fashioned radio brought joy to him. He turned it on and off with his lips, his fingers were useless. It was told of Pastor David, "He brought the joy of the Lord to all who heard his praise and saw the life he lived."

No matter what our circumstances are, we can always have a testimony that glorifies the God who created us, the Christ who died for us and testifies of the Holy Spirit of Christ who enables us!
