Blue Jay basketball opens this week

The Norton Community High School boys basketball team will have their top two scorers returning from last season's 12-9 squad when coach Doug Reusink's Blue Jays open their 2010-11 season on Thursday in the annual Topside Tip-Off Tournament at Max Jones Fieldhouse in Goodland.

Norton will open versus Mc-Cook at 3 p.m. in the Junior High

Returning for the Blue Jays are senior Terrell Lane, 5'11" senior guard, and Jordan Wahlmeier, 6'3" junior post. Lane was leading scorer last year with 14.9 points per game and leading rebounder with 9.6 caroms per

contest. Wahlmeier was second in both, hitting 11 points per game and grabbing 5.6 rebounds per contest.

Lane hit 74 percent from the free throw line and led the team in steals and assists.

Wahlmeier was the most accurate field goal shooter with a 53.7 percent average. He led the team in blocked shots and was second high in steals.

The four other returning lettermen are: 5'11" senior Dakota Dreher, who averaged 2.7 points and 3.7 rebounds; 5'9" junior Tye Nickell, who averaged 2.1 points and 1.4 rebounds; 6' junior Dillon McConney, who averaged 2.7 points and 1.5 rebounds and 6'2" sophomore Jacob Brooks, who averaged 3.6 points and 3.2 rebounds.

Brooks was second best in field goal accuracy at 46.4 percent and fourth best in rebounding. McConney led the team in three-point shooting with an average of 46.7 percent.

Coach's comments

"We are not very big but we do have some pretty good athletes, which should make us competitive with anyone we play," said coach Reusink. "We are also short of depth to start so will need some young men from last year's junior varsity team to step up and help us.

"I think the Mid-Continent League will be tough and pretty balanced because most teams

have at least three starters returning. My pick to win would be Plainville but you can't count out Hill City with the record they had last season.

"We finished in the middle of the pack last year so, hopefully, we can improve on that."

Reusink is veteran coach

Veteran head coach Coach Reusink is beginning his 32nd year of coaching high school boys basketball teams and has compiled an overall record of 450 wins and 221 losses for an excellent 67 percent victory record. This is an average of 14.5 wins and 7.1 losses per year.

Under the tutelage of coach Reusink, the 2002-03 Norton quintet won the Class 3A state basketball championship with a 22-5 record and the 2003-04 squad was also outstanding, compiling an 18-4 record. The 2004-05 Blue Jays were 15-7.

The Norton boys' 2005-06 record was 12-8 and they finished second in the Mid-Continent League tournament. The 2006-07 squad was 14-7, tied for second in the league and placed second in the league tournament. The 2007-08 team went 15-7, placed third in the league and third in the league tournament but left Norton without any returning starters and only three lettermen for the 2008-09 season.

Coach's comments

"We just don't have a lot of experience or depth right now and, hopefully, we can develop that as the season goes along,' said coach Jilka.

"Offensively, we have to find some people who want to and can score.

"Defensively, we can be pretty good. Defense is going to have to keep us in the games and give us a chance to win in the fourth quarter.

"This group has been working hard and we quite possibly could surprise some teams this year.

"As far as the Mid-Continent League is concerned, I feel that the strongest teams will be Smith Center and Hill City.

"The league is definitely up this year as there are some very good teams from top to bottom. It will be interesting to see how we will stack up against them."

Long time tenure

In his 28 years as head coach of the Lady Blue Jays, coach Jilka's teams have won 471 games and lost 162 for a 74.4 percent winning average. Jilka's Lady Jays have averaged 16.8 wins and just 5.8 losses per season.

Following their fourth place finish in the state tournament in 2000-01, coach Jilka's 2001-02 Lady Jays finished 13-9 and placed fourth in the league. Norton compiled a 12-9 record in 2003-04 when they tied for second in the league and their season ended with a 56-49 overtime loss to Beloit in the substate tourna-

The season ended for the 2004-05 quintet with a loss to eventual champion Holcomb in the substate tournament. The Lady Jays were 17-5 that year and were undefeated league champions and also league tournament champions.

The 2005-06 Norton girls compiled an 18-2 record, were undefeated in the Mid-Continent League and runner-up in the league tournament. Their season came to a sudden close with a 44-33 loss to Riley County in the substate tournament.

The 2006-07 Lady Jays were 13-7 and also placed third in the league tournament. Their season ended with a 46-42 loss to Oberlin in the substate tournament.

The 2007-08 Norton girls won the substate championship and lost their first game in the state tournament 45-39 to Wichita Collegiate.


