Norton wrestlers win league duals tourney

nortontelearam@nwkansas.com Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School wrestling team won the championship of the Mid-Continent League Dual Wrestling Tournament held last Saturday in Ellis.

In the first round, Norton wrestled Trego and won 78-6. In the second round, the Blue Jays outscored Ellis 64-6. Round three saw Norton defeat Plainville 56-24. In round four, Norton outscored Osborne 78-6 to complete pool play 4-0 and reach the championship finals against Phillipsburg, who had won their pool with a 3-0 record.

Norton finished the day with a 45-34 win over Phillipsburg to earn the team championship.

Also in the final round, Smith Center placed third with a 35-33 win over Plainville, Trego won fifth place with a 43-18 victory over Hill City and seventh place went to Ellis with a 48-18 win over Stockton.

Coach's comments

"I was a little disappointed in our overall performance," said coach Johnson.

"I know that we won the team title but I feel that our technique needs to improve. It is more obvious to our coaching staff that we need to spend a great deal of time over Christmas break improving our technique, especially with our first and second varsity wrestlers. But, I'm confident that we will improve and we will have time over break to dedicate to technique. In fact, during Christmas break is usually the time we practice twice a day. The morning practice is technique only and the evening practice is mainly live wrestling. I will make sure all of our young men are better wrestlers for the J.R. Durham Invitational on January 8."

The Norton coaches named 189 pound wrestlers Cayleb Campbell and Kolton Harting as 'Co-Wrestlers of the Week".

"Both of these young men took turns wrestling up to the 215 pound weight class and did an excellent job," said coach

"In the two days of duals, we only lost one match at 189 and 215. Kolton is just a freshman and he really stepped in and did a good job in his first varsity action. Cayleb missed all of last year with an injury and has also done well in the heat of the varsity dual action. It is very different wrestling in dual matches because your team is counting on you to do your part.

"When Kolton took the mat against Phillipsburg on Saturday. he knew that if he won he could seal the dual for us but, if he lost, Philliipsburg still had a shot to beat us. Even though he is only a freshman, he did not let the pressure get to him and he won by a fall, which sealed the dual and MCL title for our Blue Jays."

"The tournament was a round robin format, which promotes more mat time and greater bonus points can determine tournament placing. Many of the wrestlers wrestled four or five times during the day. This is exactly the type of tournament that was needed for our second teamers early in

Alec battled back from a 4-0 deficit to tie the match in the final second of regulation. Alec was patient in the overtime period and took his opponent down for the win. Wrestler of the Week'. "At 103 pounds, Ethan Ross, who is a small 103 pounder, continues to show improvement and battle for our Blue Jays. Even though there is a size difference, Ethan does not use this as an excuse. Ethan lost his first match to eventual champion Levi Volger of Red Cloud/Blue Hill in a 7-4 decision. Ethan went 3-2 for the day and, even though he had another close loss by criteria, he ended in
