Norton sophomore sinks winning basket

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Norton Community High School sophomore point guard Tawni Griffey hit a career high 26 points for the Lady Jays in their Mid-Continent League game at Osborne on Friday night but her final shot from beyond the arc with time running out will be the one remembered!

The Lady Jays trailed 49-47 with the scoreboard clock near zero when a play designed by Norton head coach Kevin Jilka allowed Griffey to fire from threepoint range and produce an exciting 50-49 win!

Griffey actually scored 16 of her points in the fourth quarter when Norton tallied 18 which included two free throws by Kaylen Rossi.

Norton held a slim 32-30 lead heading into the final stanza but Osborne tied it and went ahead 38-32. Rossi's charity tosses made it 38-34 with 5:21 remaining. A trey by the Lady Bulldogs stretched their advantage to 41-34.

Griffey went to work. After she hit two two-point baskets and Osborne answered with one, Norton still trailed by five points. Suddenly, a trey by Griffey cut by Terrell and two free throws by the Osborne lead to 43-41 but the Lady Bulldogs answered again and it was 45-41. Osborne scored on a fast break, making it 47-41 with 2:10 left.

Griffey came through with another two-point basket at the 1:55 mark but Osborne answered again and it was 49-43. Griffey was fouled and swished two charities to cut the lead back to four points with 1:01 showing on the clock. Then, Griffey was fouled again and once again swished two charities to make it a 49-47 game.

This time, the Lady Bulldogs failed to score, Norton got the ball and the rest is history!

The two teams traded the lead back and forth during the first three quarters. Norton led 11-8 after the first period which saw Griffey hit a three-point shot, a two-point basket and free throw. Erin Terrell swish a basket and free throw and Caren Thomson find the range on a two-pointer.

The half ended with Norton on top by 20-18. Scoring for Norton in the second period were Kamilla Jones and Griffey on twopointers, a field goal and charity Dustyna Sprigg.

Both teams tallied 12 points in the fast-moving third quarter, leaving Norton still on top by two. Thomson hit two more baskets, Jones and Griffey each hit one two-pointer, Rossi buried a shot from beyond the arc and Terrell added a free throw.

"This was a huge win for us," said coach Jilka.

"Offensively, we executed well all night but struggled to score from the perimeter.

"Defensively, we have to get better. We need to be more physical. We are getting turnovers from people just taking the ball from us. We have to get better.

"We did a great job of executing our late game situation. They helped us by missing some free throws, which gave us our chance to win the game, which we did!

"Our girls did a great job of running the final play for Tawni and she stepped up and hit it! "We are going to have to play

better on Tuesday in Norton against Plainville.' Griffey finished the game hitting 3 of 6 shots from beyond the

arc for 50 percent, 6 of 13 two-

point attempts for 46 percent and 9 of 19 overall for 47 percent. She swished 5 of 6 free throws for 83 percent accuracy.

Leading scorer for the Lady Bulldogs was Jordyn Sturgeon with 21 points.

As a team, Norton connected on 4 of 14 long range shots for 29 percent, 13 of 35 two-point tries for 37 percent and 17 of 49 overall for 35 percent.

Osborne hit 3 of 3 treys for 100 percent, 18 of 38 two-point tries for 47 percent and 21 of 41 overall for 51 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton was 12 of 22 for 55 percent and Osborne was 4 of 14 for 29 percent.

The Lady Jays pulled down 15 offensive and 14 defensive rebounds for 29 total and the Lady Bulldogs grabbed 15 offensive and 19 defensive for 34 total. Leading rebounder for Norton

was Terrell with 14, followed by Rossi, Thomson, 5 each; Sprigg, 4; Jones, 1.

The Lady Jays had 9 steals and Osborne had 10. Griffey, Rossi, Terrell, Sprigg each had 2 thefts and Jones had 1.

Norton had 4 assists and Os-

borne had 6. Griffey, Terrell, Mid-Continent League play this Sprigg and Jones each had 1 assist.

Blue Jays lose to Osborne Bulldogs

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Doug Reusink's Norton Community High School boys basketball team was within striking distance of Osborne during their entire Mid-Continent League game at Osborne on Friday night and even took a slim lead on occasion but the Bulldogs were on top 51-43 at the final buzzer.

The score was tied 15-all after one quarter and Osborne led 24-23 at halftime. The Bulldogs led 38-35 after three periods but senior guard Terrell Lane buried a three-point shot with 5:45 left in the game to tie the score at

After two free throws by Dakota Dreher and a basket by Jordan Wahlmeier, Osborne led by just 44-42 with 3:09 left. Norton hit only a free throw by Wahlmeier the rest of the way and the Bulldogs swished two more baskets and three charities to stretch their final margin of victory to

Wahlmeier scored 10 of Norton's 15 first quarter points on five baskets but hit only one more basket in the second quarter in addition to one in the fourth plus his free throw.

Lane started with a trey in the first quarter and provided most of the firepower for the Blue Jays with two baskets from beyond the arc, a two-pointer and two free throws in the third quarter.

"This was another tough loss with plenty of opportunities to win," said coach Reusink. "We just have not been able to make plays when we need to. We would get the lead but wouldn't make a stop on the defensive end to stay there.

"As a group, we are struggling with consistency on the offensive end and just do not play with confidence, causing us to make some bad decisions.

"It is not going to get any easier with Plainville, the best opponent we have played since the first game of the season, in our next game on Tuesday." Lane finished the game with 16

points on 4 of 7 from beyond the arc for 57 percent, 1 of 5 two-point baskets for 20 percent and 5 of 12 overall for 42 percent. He was perfect on 2 free throws.

Wahlmeier added 15 points on 7 of 13 from the field for 54 percent and 1 of 4 charities for 25 percent.

As a team, Norton hit 5 of 13 from long range for 39 percent, 11 of 33 two-point tries for 33 percent and 16 of 46 overall for just 35 percent.

The Bulldogs were much more accurate with their shooting. They

hit 1 of 3 treys for 33 percent, 22 of 41 two-point attempts for 54 percent and 23 of 44 overall for 52 percent.

From the charity stripe, Norton converted 6 of 11 for 55 percent and Osborne connected on 4 of 14 for 29 percent.

Norton outrebounded Osborne 26-21. The Blue Jays pulled down 11 offensive and 15 defensive rebounds and the Bulldogs grabbed 6 offensive and 15 defensive

Leading rebounder for Norton was Wahlmeier with 14, followed by Dakota Dreher, Terrell Lane, Jacob Brooks, 3 each; Dillon McConney, Luke Ninemire, Tye Nickell, 1 each.

Norton was credited with just 4 steals but Osborne had none.
