Norton Durham champion for eighth straight time

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School varsity wrestling team won their eighth straight J.R. Durham Invitational Wrestling Tournament championship on Saturday in the NCHS

Stull Gymnasium. Norton took an early team lead and led all the way although Hoxie and Mill Valley gave the Blue Jays a run for their money in the finals.

The tournament ended with Norton scoring 165 points, followed by Hoxie with 154 and Mill Valley with 151. Hoxie passed Mill Valley with a win in the 285 pound match.

Finishing in fourth place was the always competitive Scott City wrestling team, who scored 122 points to edge Smith Center, who ended with 121 points.

Placing sixth was Cozad with 104, followed by McCook, 102; Beloit, 92; Leoti, 55; Thomas More Prep-Hays, 43; Oakley, 38; Atwood, 35.

Norton had two champions, five others in the finals who placed runner-up, one third place finisher, one fourth placer and three sixth place finishers. The Blue Jays were open at 119 and 215 and had a junior varsity wrestler

Repeating as tournament champions were senior Troy Bainter, 130 and senior Landon "Tug" Keiswetter, 160

Wrestling in the finals but coming out second were: freshman Branson Addington, 103; sophomore John Risewick, 112; senior Billy Broeckelman, 140; senior Spencer Shirk, 171 and junior Caleb Campbell, 189.

Sophomore Eli Bozarth finished third at 145 and freshman junior varsity wrestler Alec Hager placed fourth at 112.

Placing sixth in their weight classes were: freshman junior varsity wrestler Ethan Ross, 103; sophomore junior varsity wrestler Cody Ellis, 140 and senior Josh Asbury, 285.

Coach's comments

"Overall, I'm pleased that we had seven wrestlers in the championship finals but disappointed that only two won championships and also that we only had two in the consolation championships. Several of our wrestlers in the championships were either ahead or tied and let a victory get away from them.

"Now is a good time for this to happen. Everything before regional and state tournaments is practice. We can lose some now but have the mentality that things will pick up down the road.

"We can wrestle much better. "Some of our wrestlers took a

step forward. Branson Addington and Caleb Campbell both made it to the championship finals."

The Norton coaches selected Branson Addington and Eli Bozarth as their "Co-Wrestlers of the Week" for the Blue Jays.

"This was their coming out day. They did well," said coach Johnson.

Named "Outstanding Wrestler" of the tournament was Clay Mulligan, Scott City's 112 pound wrestler, who trailed Norton's John Risewick in the championship finals but rallied to pin Risewick

103 - Norton freshman Branson Addington was seeded No.5. He shutout Landon Scott, Mill Valley, 6-0 and edged No.1 seed Clint Rogers, Smith Center, 6-4 to reach the championship finals versus No.2 seed John Solko, Atwood. The score was tied 2-all after one period but Addington was pinned in 3:40 to place runner-up.

Rogers placed third with a fall over No.3 seed Bryce Fairleigh, Scott City, in 2:25. Scott finished fifth with a fall in 4:47 over Norton freshman junior varsity wrestler Ethan Ross. Ross also wrestled Solko in the first round and was pinned in 2:34, then was pinned in 1:15 by Rogers.

112 - Blue Jay sophomore John Risewick was seeded No.1. He pinned Cory Howard, Oakley, in 1:26 and won a 17-1 technical fall over No.5 seed junior varsity freshman teammate Alec Hager. In the championship finals, he wrestled No.2 seed Clay Mulligan, Scott City, and was leading until he got out of position and was pinned in 3:58 to place runner-up.

Hager pinned Ethan Wessling, Beloit, in 3:02 in the first round before wrestling Risewick. In the consolation bracket, Hager pinned Mack Reagan, Smith Center, in 4:17 before losing a 5-2 decision to No.3 seed Jesus Gauna, McCook, in the consolation championship to finish fourth.

125 - Norton junior Justin Waggoner was seeded No.4. He was pinned in 2:40 by No.5 seed Ryan Hodges, Mill Valley. In the consolation bracket, he was pinned in 4:01 by Bowe Behymer, Beloit.

No.1 seed Calvin Ochs, Hoxie, won the championship by pinning No.3 seed Denton Tankersley, Leoti, in 3:56.

He made Joe Salinas, Leoti, count the lights in 1:25, then downed No.5 seed Zach Fischer, Smith Center, with a fall in 1:00. In the title match, Bainter faced Jake Ellis, Mill Valley. Bainter led 8-5 after one period, 9-5 after two and won 13-7.

Winning third place was No.3 seed Britton Sealock, Hoxie, with a fall in 4:42 over Fischer. Fifth place went to Kyle Groshong, McCook, with a fall in 3:17 over Salinas.

135 - Norton freshman Austin

Hager moved up from the junior varsity to wrestle 135 for the Blue Jays. He wrestled No.1 seed Donovan Schamberger, Hoxie, in the first round and was pinned in 1:51. In the consolation bracket, he was pinned in 4:56 by No.5 seed Mario Manciallas, Leoti.

Schamberger pinned his way to the championship. He pinned No.2 seed Logan Hunke, Cozad, in 2:46 to win the gold.

No.3 seed Grant Holub, TMP, placed third with a 3-2 decision over Levi Hefner, Oakley. Manciallas placed fifth with a 14-10 decision over No.4 seed Clay Pickel, Smith Center.

140 - Blue Jay senior Billy Broeckelman was seeded No.2. He won a 15-0 technical fall over Bryer Porter, Leoti and a 13-4 major decision over No.3 seed Kyle Carlson, Cozad, to reach the finals. He met No.1 seed Kale Newell, Smith Center, for the title. It was a very close match. Broeckelman trailed 3-2 after one period and 3-2 after the scoreless second period. Newell added two more points in the final period to win 5-2.

No.3 seed Kyle Carlson, Cozad, won third with a 3-2 decision over No.4 seed Keldon Osterman, McCook. Fifth place went to Warren Kropp, Scott City, with a 16-0 technical fall over Norton sophomore junior varsity wrestler Cody Ellis.

Ellis lost a 12-3 major decision to Carlson in the first round, then decisioned Porter 8-4 and was pinned in 2:30 by Osterman prior to wrestling Kropp.



Seeded No.1, he pinned Manuel Carrillo, Scott City, in 38 seconds, then won a 12-2 major decision over No.4 seed Kyler Atwood, Smith Center. In the championship finals, he wrestled No.2 seed Braden Mayes, Beloit. Keiswetter led 4-1 after one period and 7-1 after two before winning an 11-2 major decision.
