Congresswoman shot

An Arizona congresswoman federal court Monday. remains in critical condition after an assassination attempt Saturday.

Rep. Gabrille Giffords was shot in the head before a man with a handgun sprayed bullets into a small crowd gathered to talk with her at a Tucson supermarket. She had been holding her first meeting with constituents of the new year. Giffords, a Democrat, had been sworn in for her third term earlier in the week.

Six people were killed in the shooting, including 9-yearold Christina Taylor Green and John Roll, Arizona's chief federal judge. Fourteen were wounded. The first memorial services were Tuesday.

Giffords was rushed to University Medical Center, where doctors reported she was responsive. The bullet appeared to have passed through one hemisphere of her brain from front to back, leaving much of her brain intact. As of this morning, she was still in critical condition but breathing on her own and able to move both arms. CT scans showed no further swell-A woman grabbed his spare ing in her brain, and doctors said that was a good sign.
