Lady Jays hold lead entire game

nortontelearam@nwkansas.com The Goodland High School girls basketball team easily defeated Norton in the Topside Tip-Off Tournament in Goodland to start the current season but found a different Lady Jay quintet waiting for them when they arrived on Tuesday evening in Norton where they were defeated 39-29.

Norton had changed so much that they never trailed in Tuesday's game in the NCHS Stull Gym!

The score was similar to the one during the previous encounter but reversed from when the Lady Cowboys prevailed 39-31.

This time around, the Lady Jays put together quarter leads of 19-8, 25-12 and 33-18.

Coming off a runner-up finish last week in the Mid-Continent League Tournament, Norton outshot Goodland from the field, had double the rebounds of the Lady Cowboys and quite a few less turnovers. Steals were fairly even. Had Goodland not hit 9 of 12 free throws for 75 percent, Norton's margin of victory would have been larger.

"We played really good defense all night long," said Norton head girls basketball coach Kevin Jilka. "That's pretty good when you hold them to one offensive rebound.

"Our offensive execution was also good.

"It was a tough game after last week's league tournament and I'm proud that our girls came back and played so well.

"They handled us good out

there. This was a good win for

"The only negative is that we are still not making a high enough percentage of free throws.

"I like our team chemistry right now. We're playing very well together. Our upcoming schedule is intensely tough but our girls feel good about what they are doing.'

The first quarter on Tuesday night was Norton's best from a scoring standpoint when they put in 19 points. Senior post Erin Terrell got free under the goal for four baskets, sophomore point guard Tawni Griffey hit a three-point and two-point basket, senior guard Dustyna Sprigg hit a two-point basket and two free throws and junior post Caren Thomson connected for a twopoint basket.

The second quarter was a defensive battle with Norton outscoring Goodland 6-4. Sprigg hit all three Norton field goals in the period.

An 8-6 third quarter in the Lady Jays' favor was also a defensively oriented one. Griffey hit two baskets and Terrell and Thomson each hit one.

Goodland outscored Norton 11-6 in the fourth quarter with the Lady Cowboys' Ashley Archer hitting 8 of her game high 18 points. Norton's final points came on a trey by Griffey, two free throws by Terrell and one charity by Sprigg.

The Lady Jays had three girls in double figure scoring. Griffey and Terrell each scored 12 points and Sprigg finished with 11.

Griffey hit 2 of 5 from beyond the arc for 40 percent, 3 of 8 twopoint tries for 38 percent and 5 of 13 overall for 38 percent.

Terrell connected on 5 of 11 from two-point land for 45 percent and 2 of 7 charities for 29 percent.

Sprigg hit 4 of 8 from the field for 50 percent accuracy and 3 of 4 from the charity stripe for 75 percent.

As a team, Norton hit 2 of 6 trey tries for 33 percent, 14 of 30 two-point attempts for 47 percent and 16 of 36 overall for 44 percent. Goodland swished 2 of 5 from beyond the arc for 40 percent, 7 of 19 two-point tries for 37 percent and 9 of 24 overall for 37 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton hit just 5 of 11 for 45 percent compared to the Lady Cowboys' 9 of 12 for 75 percent.

The Lady Jays pulled down 9 offensive and 9 defensive rebounds for 18 total. Goodland grabbed 1 offensive and 8 defensive caroms for 9 total.

Terrell led Norton with 7 rebounds, followed by Sprigg, 5; Griffey, Thomson, 2 each; Katelyn Engelbert, Kaylen Rossi, 1 each.

The Lady Jys had 10 assists and the Lady Cowgirls had 6. Griffey led with 4, followed by Terrell, 3; Sprigg, 2; Engelbert, 1.

Norton stole the ball 7 times and Goodland had 9 thefts. Terrell and Sprigg each had 3 steals, followed by Griffey, 2; Thomson, 1.

Norton had 14 turnovers and Goodland lost the ball 20 times.

Junior varsity

The Norton junior varsity girls were defeated 36-25 by Goodland.

Norton trailed by quarters 10-4, 18-12 and 22-14.

Leading scorer for Norton was Johnnye Ruder with 10 points, followed by Bailey Ambrosier, 5; Antjelica Pfannenstiel, 4; Kamilla Jones, 3; Alec Melvin, 2; Katelyn Engelbert, 1.

Hope Cochran led Goodland with 22 points.

"Layups and putbacks was the storyline tonight," said Norton assistant girls coach George Rossi.

"Unfortunately, it was Goodland getting the layups and putbacks.

"I am disappointed in our effort because we know we are better than what we showed tonight. Our girls must get mentally and physically tougher."

Next action

The Norton girls and boys do not play this evening.

They will travel to Smith Center on Tuesday to play the very good Lady Red and Redman teams, beginning at 5 p.m.

First dual loss of season

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton Community High School wrestling team suffered their first dual loss of the season on Tuesday evening when an outstanding Kearney, Neb. team outscored them 39-30 in Kearney. Norton had seven wins but only two of them by pins. Kearney won six matches but five were by falls. Norton also forfeited at 215 pounds.

The dual began at 112 pounds and Norton gave up three straight pins to fall behind 18-0. Alec Hager was pinned in 3:53 by Ryan Bauer at 112 pounds, John Risewick was pinned in 5:34 by Asa Stansbury at 119 pounds and Justin Waggoner was pinned in 3:23 by Austin Marshall at 125 pounds. "R.J. Ellis at 119 pounds stayed home with sickness so we bumped John Risewick up to 119 pounds and inserted Alec Hager at 112 pounds," said Norton head wrestling coach Bill Johnson. "After Hager gave up a fall, it looked like Risewick was in the running to pull out a win at 119 pounds but he got rolled through after throwing his opponent to his back and was pinned.

"This was definitely a huge momentum switch in the dual. That was the only change in our lineup."

Norton rebounded with three straight wins. At 130 pounds, Troy Bainter won a 4-0 decision over Jacob Oertle; at 135 pounds, Brett Terrell won a 5-2 decision over Zach Rhees and, at 140 pounds, Billy Broeckelman won a 13-7 decision over Noah Gable.


These three wins made the score 18-9 in favor of Kearney.

Norton dropped the next two matches as Eli Bozarth lost a 10-8

Asbury recorded the second fall of the night for the Blue Jays when he pinned Aaron Bisbce in 3:28 of their 285 pound match to cut the Kearney lead to 33-30.

The final team score depended upon the results of the last match, the 103 pound match between Norton's Branson Addington and Kearney's Hunter Bamford. Addington was pinned in 3:45 to make the final score 39-30.

"Branson held off Kearney's defending state champion Bamford as long as possible before being pinned," said coach Johnson.

Zimmerman was also honored this season as a first team freshman All-American selection by Rivals.com, CollegeFootball-News.com and Phil Steele.

A Junction City High School graduate, Zimmerman was one of K-State's most consistent defenders during the 2010 season. His 74 tackles ranked second among Big 12 freshmen and he was fourth leading tackler for the Wildcats.

Zimmerman also intercepted three passes, including two against Texas, and returned a punt 41 yards at Colorado, the longest by a Wildcat since 2008.

A second team All-Big 12 honoree by the league's coaches and an honorable mention pick as the conference's freshman defensive player of the year, Zimmerman was the first true freshman in school history to earn all-conference honors from the league's coaches.

Ty is the son of Stef and Randall Zimmerman of Junction City. He is the grandson of Bobbi and Duane Hand of Junction City, former residents of Norton.
