Eisenhower Spelling Bee winners to advance

After eight rounds, four students were still in their seats. Two of the seated contestants already knew where they placed. John Stanton, fourth grade, was the third place winner and Cale Patterson, fifth grade, was the alternate.

The Norton County Spelling Bee will be held at the Norton's East Campus on Feb. 9 at 4 p.m. The county winners will receive a plaque from The Norton Telegram and a Dictionary and Thesaurus from Prairie Land Electric. The first place winner will advance to the Sunflower Spelling Bee.

Spelling Bees are sponsored nationally by Scripps National Spelling Bee. The Great Bend Tribune sponsors the state Sunflower Spelling Bee that will be held in March.
