New exhibits on display

During your next visit to the Norton Public Library, allow extra time to enjoy the current exhibits

Nancy Moore has shared some of her collection of chickens and nests. Her collection started with one that belonged to her grandmother, Minnie Claar, Oberlin. Nancy has been adding to her collection through the years from antique stores and garage sales. Now she has about 75 covered dishes as well as other items like salt and pepper shakers and pot holders. Nancy's favorite one belonged to her grandmother, even though the bottom was broken several years ago.

Joan Streck's exhibit features dolls, doll clothes and furniture that are family heirlooms. The furniture, made by her grandfather, dates back to the early 1900's. Benjamin Fritz made the furniture for Joan's mother and her aunt when they were girls.

The larger doll was given to Joan when she was about five years old. The doll has human hair. The clothes that are exhibited were handmade and came with the doll The cupie doll was found

out and closing the family home. It is made of bisque. The three tiny dolls belonged to her aunt and were given to Joan as a teen. They are of bisque and probably 100 years old.

Ada Arford's collection features mottoes, poems and sayings. For some reason, these framed treasures have been called mottoes although poems would be a more accurate depiction. Ada has collected these from shops and auctions through the years.

These were most popular during the 1920's and 1930's. About every subject is covered, however, "Mother" has to be the most common subject with "Friendship" not far behind. Some of the makers were Buzza, Reliance, Gibson, Hallmark and Art Publishing Co. A number of poems have the name of the original author: Edgar Guest seems to be one of the favorites.

Purchase prices ran from \$1 to \$30. The sizes for these ran from quite small to 12"x 15".



Profile #1 (Health Profile and CBC)\$40.00 HEALTH PROFILE CONTAINS:

Electrolytes - (Sodium, potassium, chloride and total carbon dioxide) These are major indicators of kidney and hormonal functions. Electrolytes are essential for the body's acid-base balance and the operation of nerves and muscles, especially the heart.

Kidney Functions - (BUN, creatinine) These indicators are used to monitor kidney function. Liver Functions - (Total albumin, globulin) These tests can be used in detecting and/or monitoring liver

function damage, tissue damage or inflammation.

Alkaline Phosphate - (Uric acid, calcium, phosphorus) Used for detection and monitoring of bone, tissue and parathyroid disease, such as arthritis, gout, bursitis and lupus.

Glucose - This test is to measure blood sugar levels and is used to help diagnose/monitor diabetes mellitus. **Cholesterol** - (Including HDL, LDL, VLDL, triglycerides and ratio of LDL/HDL) these are fats produced in the liver that combine with fatty oils in the blood stream. Cholesterol is further broken down and measured as HDL (good cholesterol) and LDL (bad cholesterol). The person who has higher levels of LDL is at greater risk of heart disease. Triglycerides determine the level of simple fats in the blood. CBC - (Complete blood count with differential) This is a series of tests of the blood that provides a tremendous

amount of information about the hematogolic system, immune response and many other organ systems.
