nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton Community High School boys basketball team defeated Hill City 48-42 in the recent Mid-Continent League Tournament and the score was about the same when the two met again on Friday night in Norton but, unfortunately for the Blue Jays, it was reversed.

The Ringnecks came into the $NCHS\,Stull\,Gym\,and\,led\,most\,of$ the way after the early minutes to record a 47-41 league win.

The winner was still in doubt however when, with 2:02 left in the game, senior guard Terrell Lane hit his third basket of the contest to cut the Ringneck lead to 41-37. Then, with 1:50 left, Lane went to the free throw line and calmly hit two charities to reduce the visitors' advantage to 41-39.

Two more Hill City baskets, however, made it 45-39 and Norton's final two points by junior forward Jordan Wahlmeier were not enough to bring a Blue Jay victory.

"We did not play very well defensively and had no ball penetration on offense in the first half," said Norton head boys coach Doug Reusink.

"We played better in the second half. We made them take tough

shots but didn't finish very well on rebounds.

'Offensively, we had our opportunities but just didn't make plays at the end."

 $Norton\,trailed\,9\text{--}7\,after\,the\,first$ quarter. The Blue Jay points came on baskets by Lane, Wahlmeier and junior guard Dillon McConney and a free throw by junior guard Tye Nickell.

Sophomore forward Jacob Brooks and McConney each hit two baskets in the second quarter along with one two-pointer by Nickell but Hill City outscored them 12-10 to take a 21-17 lead at halftime.

A 14-13 third quarter in Hill City's favor made it 35-30 with one quarter remaining. Norton's third quarter points came on a trey and two-point basket by McConney, three more baskets by Brooks and Lane's second basket of the

Hill City had a 12-11 point advantage in the final period. Mc-Conney hit a trey, Wahlmeier hit his second and third baskets of the game and Lane hit his third basket and two charities.

It was not a good shooting night for most of the Blue Jays but Mc-Conney was the exception. He hit 2 of 3 from beyond the arc for 67 percent, a perfect 4 of 4 two-point attempts for 100 percent and 6

NCHS Stull Gym in Norton. The Lady Jays hit one more field goal than the Lady Ringnecks but the visitors hit four more free throws to make the

difference. "This was a great high school basketball game," said coach

Jilka. "Our girls played well. "We had lots of opportunities but couldn't make the big basket or hit free throws. We had our chances.

"I'm proud of our girls coming off the Smith Center game the night before. We didn't play well there and I didn't know how we would react but we played great!

"A basket here and a basket there could have made the difference but we didn't get that done. We'll need to get our confidence back for Tuesday's game at Oberlin."

A very close first quarter ended with Hill City leading 11-10. Sophomore point guard Tawni Griffey hit a three-point and twopoint basket, junior post Erin Terrell hit two two-point baskets and senior guard Dustyna Sprigg hit a free throw in the period.

The second quarter was also a low-scoring one with Norton edging Hill City 9-8 to tie the score at 19-all. Terrell hit two more baskets and a charity and Griffey connected on two more

baskets, as well. The visitors gained an advantage in the third quarter by outscoring Norton 20-10 to take a 39-29 lead into the final stanza. Norton's points came on three more baskets by Terrell and one each from Griffey and junior post

Caren Thomson. Hill City, who is known for their expertise on three-point goals, displayed that ability in the third period when they buried four three-pointers, two each by Lexi Hardiek and Shelby Keith.

The Lady Jays did not give up but doubled their efforts to overtake the talented Hill City squad. Terrell scored inside to start the final stanza. After a Hill City basket, Griffey buried a threepointer. Thomson hit a free throw and it was 41-35.

After another Lady Ringneck basket, senior guard Kaylen Rossi stole the ball and drove for two more points. Terrell scored again and it was 43-39 with 2:07 remaining.

Hill City turned the ball over to the aggressive Lady Jay defense and, with 1:58 left, Rossi buried a three-point shot that made it 43-42 and brought a deafening roar from the Norton crowd!

Hill City hit 1 of 2 free throws but got the rebound. With a minute remaining, another Lady Ringneck free throw was missed. Two free throws by Keith with 34.5 seconds left found the mark, however, and she hit one more with 11.8 seconds remaining to extend the final margin of victory to 5 points.

Terrell led Norton in scoring with 19 points on 9 of 16 shots for an excellent 56 percent accuracy from the field. She hit 1 of 8 free throws for 13 percent.

Griffey tallied 14 points on 2 of 4 from beyond the arc for 50 percent, 4 of 13 two-point tries for 31 percent and 6 of 17 overall for 35 percent.

Leading scorer for the Lady Ringnecks was Keith with 21 points; Hardiek added 13.

As a team, Norton hit 3 of 9 from long range for 33 percent, 15 of 39 two-point attempts for 38 percent and 18 of 48 overall for 38 percent.

Hill City swished 6 of 15 treys for 40 percent, 11 of 21 two-point tries for 52 percent and 17 of 36 overall for 47 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton hit just 3 of 14 for 21 percent and Hill City connected on 7 of 11 for 64 percent.

Rebounds were about even. Norton pulled down 8 offensive, 7 defensive rebounds for 15 total. Hill City grabbed 5 offensive and 12 defensive caroms for 17

Terrell led the Lady Jays in rebounds with 7, followed by Sprigg, 4; Thomson, 2; Griffey, Rossi, 1 each.


