# Blue Jays dominate the Panther Classic

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School varsity wrestling team turned in a dominating performance to win their eighth straight championship of the Panther Classic Wrestling Tournament on Saturday in Phillipsburg.

The Blue Jays scored 198 points to easily outdistance runner-up Phillipsburg, who tallied 139. Abilene was right behind Phillipsburg in third place with 138

Fourth place went to Hoxie with 121, followed by Beloit, 104; Hoisington, 84; St. Francis, 55; Ellis, 54.5; Lakin, 45.5; Ellsworth, 40.5; Oakley, 36; Stockton, 36; Minneapolis, 33.5; Lincoln, 29; Thomas More Prep of Hays, 24.5; Hill City, 14.

Norton had six wrestlers in the championship finals and all six won gold medals. They were: Branson Addington, 103; John Risewick, 112; Troy Bainter, 130; Billy Broeckelman, 140; Landon "Tug" Keiswetter, 160 and Spencer Shirk, 171. Eli Bozarth, 145, placed third.

Justin Waggoner, 125 and Josh Asbury, 285, both finished fourth in their weight classes. Also wrestling for Norton were

The Blue Jays had an outstanding 24-11 won-loss record and excellent 16-4 pin ratio.

#### Coach's comments

"The highlight of the tournament for us was having six wrestlers in the finals and all six winning," said coach Johnson.

"I don't remember another tournament of this caliber that we've had this happen!

"To score 198 points in a tournament like this is amazing. This is a tough tournament with lots of ranked wrestlers. Abilene brings a lot of good wrestlers.

"There were five unbeaten wrestlers coming into the tournament and only two remained Saturday night.

"I'm happy with the way we finished the tournament, placing nine out of our 12 wrestlers.

Our Brett Terrell at 135 pounds was one of those unbeaten wrestlers but, in his defense, he wrestled in the toughest weight class by far. Dalton Davis, Lakin,

came in 19-0 and seeded No.1 and Courtney Strauss, Abilene, was seeded No.2 at 29-0. Brett was seeded No.3 at 16-0.

"There were actually five very quality wrestlers in that division. Strauss won the championship by pinning Davis."

Strauss was named the "Chuck Lovenstein Outstanding Wrestler" for the tournament by vote of the team coaches.

"Our senior 160 pound wrestler "Tug" Keiswetter had a great tournament," said coach Johnson. "He was seeded No.2 behind Abilene's Collen Picking, who brought a 23-0 record into the tournament. Picking was a Class 4A state runner-up last year and decisioned Tug in overtime at 152 pounds in last year's Panther Classic. Tug dominated him this time and won the championship with a 5-2 decision!"

For his performance, the Norton coaches named Landon "Tug" Keiswetter as the Norton "Wrestler of the Week".

"I was also proud of our 103 pound freshman Brandon Addington winning his first tournament title," said coach Johnson. "His most important win came in the semi-finals where he pinned Lane Hoffman of St. Francis. That will be a big plus for regional

"As far as conditioning, I think we're getting there. We've left a little room to get in absolute top physical condition for the regional."

The Blue Jays will not wrestle again in competition until the Regional Tournament on Friday and Saturday, February 18-19 but coach Johnson says the practice schedule will be such that his Blue Jays will be working hard to get in that top physical condition.

Sahlfeld placed fourth when he was pinned by No.5 seed Caleb Studley, Phillipsburg, in the third period. No.1 seed Dylan Schumacher, TMP, won the championship with a 15-0 technical fall over Gallaway.

Ellis is now 10-9 for the season and Schumacher is now 28-2.

Three Blue Jays hit shots from beyond the arc as Norton buried 10 of 20 for 50 percent accuracy!

In fact, the Blue Jays hit better from three-point land than twopoint range where they were 11 of 30 tries for 37 percent.

It was an up and down game. Norton led by just 15-11 after one quarter but outscored the Redmen 11-4 in the second period to lead 26-15 at halftime.

Norton hit five three-pointers in the first half and Smith Center hit one. The Redmen started the second half by hitting three treys in the third quarter as they outscored the Blue Jays 16-10 for their best quarter of the game and cut the Norton lead to 36-31

The Blue Jays saved the best for last and put 19 points on the scoreboard in the fourth quarter compared to 10 for the homestanding Redmen to extend the final margin of victory to 14 points.

"It was another game where we did not play as well as we are capable but it was a league win on the road.

"I felt that we were relying too much on the three-pointer of-

Norton's first quarter points came on a three-point and twopoint basket by both senior guard Terrell Lane and sophomore guard Jacob Brooks and two baskets and a free throw by junior forward Jordan Wahlmeier.

The Blue Jays hit just four baskets in the second quarter but three of them were from beyond the arc. Lane buried two more treys, junior guard Tye Nickell hit from long range and Wahlmeier scored again.

Lane continued to add on points for the Blue Jays in the third period when he found the range on another trey and two-point basket. Nickell buried another trey and Brooks hit a two-pointer.

Lane finished the contest with his fifth and sixth treys of the game in the fourth quarter. Brooks hit his second long range basket and a two-pointer, Nickell hit a free throw and Wahlmeier ended with three more baskets and one charity.

Lane scored 22 points in the game on 6 of 10 from beyond the arc for 60 percent, 2 of 5 two-point attempts for 40 percent and 8 of 15 overall for 54 percent. He did not shoot any free throws.

Wahlmeier added 14 points on 6 of 11 two-point shots for 55 percent and 2 of 5 from the charity stripe for 40 percent.

Norton's third double figure scorer was Brooks, who hit 2 of 4 from beyond the arc, 3 of 6 two-point tries and 5 of 10 for 50 percent overall and 12 points.

Leading scorer for Smith Center was Kody Molzahn with 10

As a team, Norton hit 21 of 50 field goal attempts for 42 percent. Smith Center connected on 4 of 14 from beyond the arc for 29 percent, 11 of 31 two-point tries for 36 percent and 15 of 45 overall for 33 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton swished 3 of 8 for 38 percent and Smith Center hit 7 of 12 for 58 percent.

The Blue Jays outrebounded the Redmen 31-25. Norton pulled down 9 offensive and 22 defensive rebounds and Smith Center grabbed 9 offensive and 16 defensive caroms. Junior guard Dillon McConney

and Lane were leading rebounders with 8 each, followed by Brooks, 7; Wahlmeier, 5; Nickell, Luke Ninemire, Cole Archer, 1 each. Norton had 9 steals and Smith
