Keynote speaker

Bethany Bohnenblust, a Kansas State University junior in Agriculture, FFA State President in 2008-09 and National FFA Secretary in 2009-10 from Altamont, was the keynote speaker for the evening.

> She told the audience about a track relay team she was a member of as a sophomore in high school. At the start of the season, they were supposed to be the best foursome in the state. They began well enough but by the time for the regional meet, they were not doing so well and placed fourth, barely qualifying for the state meet, which didn't turn out to their liking either.

She said they decided that they started well but made too many mistakes to finish well.

"All good athletes have a vision. They begin well and finish well,'

she said.

Bethany gave the example of two outstanding Kansas State University athletes. One was Jordy Nelson from Riley who had to walkon as a Wildcat football player, starred for K-State and this season was the leading pass receiver for the Green Bay Packers in their Super Bowl victory.

The second athlete was Jacob Pullen, all-conference K-State point guard in basketball, who finished his senior season in the NCAA Tournament with a 38point performance.

"Visualize your 80th or 100th birthday party," she said. "What will you have accomplished? Who do you want to be there?

Decisions we make now will affect our future. They will set like concrete. Once concrete hardens, it can't easily be changed.

'We should want to be around people who challenge us to make our vision come true. You want to see your future, show me your friends. Hopefully, they will challenge you.
